Katz and Nickell bid aggressively to the 20 point game. Beatty led the king of spades which Nickell ruffed in hand. Nickell led a diamond to dummy and played the singleton eight of hearts toward his king. Jacobs ducked!! His duck was fatal. Nickell won his king, ruffed a heart in dummy, and played a club to his jack and Beatty's queen. Steve had no trumps to lead and was helpless. He exited his hand with a heart which Nickell ruffed in dummy. Nickell played a club to his ace and another to Beatty's ten before claiming 11 tricks. Had Jacobs risen with his heart ace, he could have played a second round of trump leaving declarer with ten tricks max! +750 was worth 11.1 IMPs to Nickell and Katz.

East was lucky to find her partner with the QJ of clubs, making slam a good proposition. In fact, 6H cannot be defeated as the cards lie.

Knowing you cannot beat the hand legitimately, what is your best chance to make declarer go wrong?

We nearly NEVER lead from a jack-fourth holding. That said, Suzi thought for quite a while, and knowing that East/West held either eight or nine diamonds between them, she reluctantly tracked the diamond deuce, hoping I could ruff it.

Unfortunately I could not. However ... What a great result it produced!

The first trick went deuce, six, five, and three of diamonds.

Declarer, happy to have won the first trick in slam with a SIX, assumed correctly that I held the singleton five of diamonds. Now, though, she was afraid to risk the double heart finesse. If North won a heart honor, South could then ruff the second round of diamonds.

Swayed by her fear, declarer played a heart to the Ace and the roof caved-in.

The defense took four tricks for +300 and 36.5 out of 38 matchpoints.

Editor's note: The combination of J9 made the diamond lead even a worse choice. I thought I was desperate and desperate people take desperate options!



Nick's 5D bid showed all the key cards and Katz made a try for the grand.

When Katz asked for the queen of trump, it was easy for Nick to bid seven hearts with all the second round controls plus the lady in question.

Bidding and making the grand was worth 12.1 IMPs.

Asian Restaurants

The Asian Noodle Bowl on North Roselle Road is a simple Asian restaurant that serves up spectacular fare. The menu is filled with a variety of delicious options and the prices are shockingly affordable. Diners rave about the noodle dishes, especially the Malaysian noodles, especially if you are looking for some heat.



People exiting Ti Amo Café Italiano seem to only have four words on their lips: "That was so good!" This Italian café is located on Golf Road in Hoffman Estates and it is worthy of a special occasion celebration. The motto at this family friendly eatery is that they offer the finest, freshest ingredients in a unique dining experience that will seduce every taste and palate. The interior has a European feel with white tablecloths, brightly colored decorations and gentle music. During warmer months, Ti Amo has a lovely outdoor patio. The portions at Ti Amo are generous and they are delivered promptly from extremely friendly wait staff. Be prepared, you will fall in love with the Farfalle Campagnola and Capellini Caprese.

Rosebud Old World Italian is the perfect combination of high end Italian restaurant with a fun loving lounge and nightspot. This trattoria is both a sophisticated and sleek restaurant and your neighborhood hot spot. The interior is lush and inviting with hardwood floors, rich linens and a cozy fireplace. The food is completely homemade. The menu features the standard Italian fare such as thin crust pizzas, homemade pastas, seafood, pork chops and fresh salad. Portions are generous so be prepared to have leftovers. Try the Chicken Parmesan or the Whitefish Francese and you will not be disappointed.

Pompei Pizza prides itself in serving classic, high quality Italian dishes in a relaxed environment. The dishes at Pompei are crafted from three generations of Sicilian family recipes. The menu features hand cut pastas and hand rolled pizzas. Everything is made to order and prepared from scratch including the sauces and dressings. Despite its laidback and casual feel, Pompei knows how to keep its diners coming back with complimentary freshly baked bread and extremely friendly staff. The standout dish at Pompei is the enormous meatball served with marinara sauce. After filling up on dinner, save room for a cannoli. The ricotta cheese and chocolate chip filling is a delicious end to a perfect meal.

American Restaurants

Gayot.com awarded Fresh 1800 12 out of 20 stars. This American restaurant, which is located in the Hyatt Regency Woodfield, serves up seasonal fare in a nature-inspired atmosphere. The interior of this casual restaurant is soothing with its subtle green hues and sleek modern accents. Known for serving almost exclusively local fare, the menu at Fresh 1800 changes bimonthly. Expect to see items emerge from Executive Chef Hagop Hagopian's kitchen like Moroccan-spiced chicken served over a fruit filled couscous or the crab cake that has been perfectly fried and plated with a bed of cucumber, pea and grapefruit salad. On Sundays, Fresh 1800 serves up a noteworthy brunch.



Weber Grill is an all-American restaurant located on North Meachum. This restaurant received five out of five stars from Citysearch.com. The interior of Weber Grill is homely with dark wood furnishings and stone accents. The food at Weber is cooked on kettle grills, giving them a distinct flavor. A great way to taste all the goodness at Weber's is with the sampler which includes tender, teriyaki-marinated steak skewers, barbecued shrimp and a pile of onion curls. In addition to the grilled meats, the burgers and strip steak are mouthwateringly good. For certain items, including the beer can chicken, the server will provide a take home recipe for guests so they can try to reconstruct the meal at home.

Urbanspoon.com selected Portillo's Hot Dogs as the top American restaurant in the city. This laidback eatery serves up hot dogs, burgers and some of the best onion rings to be found. According to several diners, once you have tried Portillo's dogs, you may never be able to eat another hot dog again. The Italian beefs, sausages and Chicago-style dogs live up to all expectations of a Chicago area hot dog restaurant. In addition to the hot dog, make sure to make room for the cheese fries or the onion rings; dipping them in the chipotle ranch dressing is the way to go.

Schaumburg Restaurants

The top rated sushi restaurant in Schaumburg according to Urbanspoon.com is Sushi Ya on South Roselle Road. This small restaurant is tucked away in a strip mall and can be considered a hidden gem. The presentation is top notch and the complimentary edamame and miso soup is a nice touch. When dining at Sushi Ya, be prepared to wait for your perfectly crafted rolls. There tend to only be two chefs creating the sushi, which can delay food but these men are artisans and it takes time to craft the perfection that is served at Sushia Ya. A few of the best rolls include the Hawaiian maki, red dragon roll and the Schaumburg roll.



Nobus Japanese Restaurant on North Roselle Road has been described as a four star restaurant at 2 star prices. While this eatery is located in a strip mall, it serves up authentic Japanese fare that is worthy of a special detour. The interior is simple and minimalistic, but you are coming for the food, not the environment when you eat at Novus. The menu is not your traditional American-Japanese fare; you will not find Godzilla rolls in this place. Instead, expect basic sushi rolls that are masterfully created. The rolls have large pieces of fish, which is always of exceptional quality. A few of the best rolls are the nigri salmon, negi hamachi and spicy tuna.

Yelp.com awarded Daruma Japanese Restaurant with four and a half out of five stars. This eatery, which is situated on West Golf Road, has been referred to as a suburban gem. The restaurant is often filled with Japanese natives, reassuring diners of the authenticity of the fare. The interior features a sushi bar, a regular dining room and several small booth areas for private dining. Dishes like the Naporitan spaghetti and the mentaiko spaghetti are authentic and perfectly prepared. When it comes to the sushi and sashmimi, everything is reasonably price. In addition to a list of specialty rolls, the kitchen at Daruma makes all of their own sauces from a sushi dipping sauce to a tonkatsu sauce. Try the signature Harumaki roll for the perfect blend of spicy or the Daruma-Don with salmon, tuna and hamachi.



While both grand slams are cold, and the difference mathematically is miniscule, 7NT is clearly better on two counts: One, it scores more... and Two, there is NO danger of a ruff off the opening lead.

On the other hand, if you are going to bid 7NT, shouldn't you set diamonds as trumps so you can ask for specific kings?



In fact, Jiang_Gu jumped the auction to get there.

With the king of diamonds onside and hearts behaving, there was no way to defeat the contract.
