Nickell disdained the lead of the unbid suit, choosing instead the unusual lead of the king of dummy's first bid suit. This allowed Kranyak to discard his club loser on the king of spades... making 6!

Baze chose the more normal lead of the seven of clubs. The result? 16 IMPs to Deustch.

Interestingly, at both tables in the Ekeblad/Schwartz match, they played four hearts.

## All or Nothing Lead in the Semi-Finals

Opening leads are among the hardest thing in bridge. All you have to go on is the auction and the thirteen cards you have in your hand. One of the all-time greats found a most unusual lead against 3NT. Here is the hand:


## Partners Can Shake Hands but They Shouldn't Squeeze Each Other!

| West - Lazard | North - Soloway | East - Bramley | South - Hamman |

Lazard led the $\boldsymbol{~} 3$ and the queen held in dummy. Hamman led a low club off dummy to the jack and ace. Sidney switched to the four of diamonds. At this point, Bramley won the ace.


The correct play by Bramley is dependent on his partner's red suit holdings. If Lazard holds the $\uparrow K$, ten fourth of hearts and only three diamonds, it is important for Bramley to insert the $\uparrow T$ to keep communication open even when partner holds Qxx instead of Kxx of diamonds. It also keeps the count from being rectified for the spade, heart squeeze. Of course, if partner held the ace of spades and the Kxx of diamonds with no $\vee \mathrm{T}$, Bramley must win the ace of diamonds as he did and continue diamonds to keep declarer from scoring nine tricks.

Also, if partner holds Kxxx of diamonds, East must win the ace and continue diamonds to beat the hand. It is never easy to be in this position.

As it was, when Bramley won the ace of diamonds and continued with the jack, his side was able to take three diamond tricks but Lazard fell victim to a major suit squeeze.

## Missed Opportunities



In the closed room in the Deutsch/Nickell match, North/South got to four diamonds making five. In the open room where Bramley was North and Lazard was South, they arrived in five diamonds. They were down in the match and the specs in the VuGraph were rooting for Bramley to make the hand.

On the surface, the hand looks easy. Hamman opened a 14-16 no-trump. Soloway transferred to spades and Bramley bid two spades as Michaels. When Lazard bid three clubs, pass or correct, Bramley corrected to three diamonds. Lazard raised and Bramley put it in game.

The specs could see that there were only two losers: one spade and one club. However, Bramley tried a line that would allow him the luxury of making the hand without having to guess out the spade position. He tried ruffing out clubs to pitch away the spade cards. Unfortunately for Bramley, the straight-up spade guess would have worked. And the club position was hopeless. Bramley used up all his trumps, and by the time he guessed the spade position, Hamman was able to win his ace of spades and cash his good club to defeat the contract one trick.

## One of Many Big Swings

When your team has a big lead, you hope for flat boards. When you're down, you hope for volatility. The final segment of the semi-finals certainly catered to big swings.

On the first board, Berkowitz and Cohen held the N/S cards for the Schwartz team. They bid to $4 \vee$ with no opposition. (see below) Similarly, in the other match, Bramley and Lazard bid to $5 \bullet$ :

In both matches, the other tables bid to 3NT.
Gitelman opened 1NT and was raised to 3NT. Meckwell had an artificial club auction to land in the same spot.
Against Gitelman, Krekorian led the $\boldsymbol{\sim}$. Gitelman played the jack from dummy and E/W had no trouble unblocking the spade suit to set the hand.

Against Rodwell, Baze led the $\mathbf{4}$ 2. Rodwell played low from dummy; Cohler won the ace and returned his fourth best spade. After winning the king, Baze returned the ten and Cohler had to decide whether Baze started with three of four spades. He decided to overtake the ten and the suit blocked! There was no swing in this match.

In the other room, Lazard bid boldly with the South cards and played $5 *$ doubled for a 1700 point set. Imagine his pleasure when his teammates said, "Win 11!"

On a diamond lead, $7 \vee$ is straightforward, but Rodwell found the best lead of a club, and the hand appears doomed. Cohler found an amazing route to bring home the hand. He won the king of clubs, cashed the ace of diamonds and ruffed a diamond. He cashed the ace of spades and played the ace of clubs. When North discarded a diamond, Gary discarded a diamond too. This was followed by the queen of clubs on which North discarded his last diamond and declarer shed a spade. Now Cohler made the key play. He led the nine of hearts and when Meckstroth followed low, Cohler ran the nine!! Now he was able to cash the spade king and crossruff for 13 tricks.

Since Cohler led the nine of hearts before cashing dummy's ace, a cover by North would do no good. Cohler would still be able to make the hand by returning to dummy with a spade, trumping a loser low and crossruffing for the remainder of the tricks. Great play, Gary!!
