No Smoking Policy: No smoking is allowed in or around the playing area, lobby, washrooms, fire exits, or service areas.

Partnerships: Singles should check in at the partnership desk 45 minutes before game time to allow the partnership people time to arrange partners. The desk will be open prior to the morning, afternoon, and evening sessions.

Hospitality and Information Desk: Check there for hand records, tournament schedules, and area information. A bulletin box on the desk is available for you to submit any interesting hands, amusing bridge-related stories, or puzzles for publication. Score Corrections: For pair events, the score correction period expires at the start of the next session. See the director as soon as possible if you discover an error in your score. The appeal period for a director's ruling expires thirty minutes after the completion of the session.

Opening Lead: ♠Q

Here we have an illustration of a balancing double of a 1NT rebid. Most players would confuse this double with a balancing takeout double, but Lawrence teaches this double as penalty, asking for the lead of the first suit bid in dummy.

If West understands it, he passes and leads the queen of spades. Declarer will probably be set at least one trick when he ducks, wins the continuation, and leads a heart to the jack at trick three.

One way to recognize the double is to memorize this formula: The penalty double is:

- (1) a balancing double,
- (2) of 1NT,
- (3) after at least one suit has been bid by the opponents.

Opening Lead: ♠3

John Swanson (West) and Paul Soloway (East) put up a nice defense to defeat 3NT in today's hand from a Bermuda Bowl. The 1♣ opening was part of the "Roman Club" system, and the 2♣ response was forcing. Soloway got his partner off to the right lead with his 2♠ overcall.

Swanson led his partner's suit and declarer played the 10 from dummy, covered by the queen and ace. Next came two rounds of diamonds, but Soloway held up his ace. With three tricks in, declarer tried the ace-king of clubs. When Soloway showed out, he continued with a third club to West's queen, unblocking the 10 and 8, so that dummy's 7 of clubs was the high club.

Swanson did not panic, as many might. Instead of shifting to a heart (which would have given the ninth trick), he led a third diamond to his partner's ace. Then Soloway returned the jack of hearts. It appeared that declarer had nine tricks: one spade, one heart, three diamonds and four clubs. But he couldn't score both his last diamond in hand and the two clubs in dummy. The entry to the diamond trick was in clubs!

Declarer could have made the contract by continuing with a third round of diamonds. Soloway would shift to hearts, but declarer wins in dummy and plays three rounds of clubs. West is now endplayed.

GRAND NATIONAL TEAMS 2012-2013: WIN A TRIP TO ATLANTA! NEW OPPORTUNITIES TO SUPPORT OUR TEAMS

Dear D14 players, club managers, GNT Unit Coordinators and Unit Presidents,

The District 14 competition for the 2012-2013 Grand National Teams (GNT) began on September 1, 2012. The Grand National Teams (GNTs) are one of two ACBL "grass roots" events. The North American Pairs is the other grass roots event in which your players can win red and gold points without leaving their unit area. GNT competition moves through three levels: (1) club qualifying games with a **full sectional rating**, (2) unit qualifying games and (3) the District 14 Finals which will be held in New Brighton, MN. On April 27-28, 2013.

GNT competition is divided into four flights: **Championship** Flight (unlimited masterpoints), **Flight A** for players with fewer than 5,000 masterpoints, **Flight B** for players with fewer than 2,000 master-points, and **Flight C** for Non-Life Masters with fewer than 500 masterpoints. Unlike Open events, the GNT district finals is a peer-based competition. You get to take the measure of your play vs. players of like ability. Winning teams received \$1820 this year, and recent district and ACBL board actions may boost the teams' subsidies significantly next year. Flight eligibility was established by ACBL's September masterpoint cycle produced on August 6, 2012. Masterpoints won after this cycle do not impact flight eligibility for these events.

The four flights compete separately at the district finals. Winning teams in each flight receive a subsidy to compete in the Summer Nationals in Atlanta. In July 2013.

Flight B & C players qualify for unit or district finals in club-qualifying games if their team:

1. Wins one-half or more of their matches in a Swiss Teams (a tie is one-half of a win)
2. Finishes average or higher in scoring system used to rank teams (VP or win-loss)
3. Finishes in the top 50% within a stratum or flight in the scoring system used

Note to club Directors: ACBLScore does not always qualify every team eligible by the above rules. It might be necessary to add manual qualifications before making the results official.

In a Unit in which only one club qualification event is held, all Flight C players who participate in the event will qualify for the District Final.

Flight A and Championship flight players need only play in a prior club qualify to be eligible for play in the District final.

Encourage your players to participate in these events. Players should encourage their clubs to schedule regular club qualifying games to win colored masterpoints. If club managers do not plan to schedule any club qualifying games, the unit may schedule qualifying games.

New Opportunities:

This summer, the ACBL Board, approved the establishment of a **Grass Roots Fund**.

They also designated a Grass Roots Fund Month in December. Clubs can hold as many Grass Roots Fund games as they want in December, and also one Grass Roots Fund game in any month that does not "belong" to another fund.

Item 122-55 Establish and Define Purposes of the Grass Roots Fund

The ACBL hereby establishes a Grass Roots Fund. The month of December is designated as "Grass Roots Fund Month." Clubs may hold special games under the same rules and regulations applicable to the other special fund months (currently benefiting the Junior and International Funds and the ACBL Charity Foundation.) Funds raised shall be returned annually no later than March 31 to the individual District in which those funds were raised, and shall be used by the District to help fund Grass Roots Events.

Grass Roots Events are defined as the Grand National Teams and the North American Pairs. The ACBL shall not charge the Districts any fee for the cost of collecting and disbursing these funds.

The Grass Roots Fund shall be considered an additional, eligible beneficiary from regionally rated games at sectionals along with the Junior and International Funds and the ACBL Charity and Educational Foundations.

Your club can run one **GNT Fund Raiser Game** with a full sectional rating every year for each of their sanctions. This game may be either a individual, pair or team event. The revenues received by District 14 from your GNT Fund Raiser Game helps reimburs GNT champions for their entry fees at the NABC finals.

GRAND NATIONAL TEAM FUND-RAISER EVENTS <http://web2.acbl.org/documentLibrary/units/UnitGameCoordHB.pdf>

Units are urged to encourage their clubs to support the idea of raising financial aid for GNT qualifiers by running Grand National Team fund-raiser events. A portion of the money raised is used to assist players with expenses associated with attending the national finals at the Summer NABC.

The unit GNT coordinator should encourage clubs to run as many of these games as it has sanctioned sessions. The GNT fund-raiser event can be run as a pair game, team game or can use any special format that will encourage players to participate. The masterpoints for the fund-raisers are sectional rated and the sanction fee is regular club game and table fees. An additional fee will be donated to the district (maximum of \$6 per table) to defray team expenses. [D14 fee is \$4/ table]

Call the Special Events Department at ACBL headquarters if you have questions about scheduling & running this event.

Units can **offer 2 regionally rated games at their sectionals**. This is a 40% boost in masterpoint payouts. \$4/table from these games are forwarded to the ACBL. If you designate the "Grass Roots Fund" as the beneficiary, that \$4/table will come back to our district so that we can boost subsidies for both our NAP and GNT champions.

SPECIAL GAMES at SECTIONALS (112-58)

A. All Units (i.e. Sectional Sponsors), are permitted to run up to two (2) special game sessions at each Sectional with the exception of STaCs. In the USA, these special games may be to benefit the ACBL Charity Foundation, the ACBL Educational Foundation, the ACBL International Fund or the ACBL Junior Fund. **[AND NOW THE GRASS ROOTS FUND]** In other countries, they may benefit the NBO equivalent, if it exists, or the ACBL fund/foundation if it does not. The choice of beneficiary shall be made by the tournament sponsor.

B. Such a special game may be run as an open game, senior game, team or pair game, newcomer game, or any other game that is run at a Sectional.

C. The masterpoint awards will be regionally rated silver points.

D. The Sponsor of the sectional will be charged USD \$1.00 per player. In Canada the charge will be CAN \$1.00 per player. In other countries, the sponsor will be charged USD \$1.00 per player. These funds shall be included in the tournament report and shall be dispersed to the appropriate organization chosen by the tournament sponsor.

E. The normal sanction fee for Sectionals will also be charged to the Sponsoring Organization.

Feel free to contact me regarding any questions you might have about the GNTs. Encourage your unit to hold a GNT Unit Final, not only for the gold points that can be won, but for the additional subsidy available to District final winners who played in a Unit Final. My long range goal for each winning team in each of the four flights to receive \$2,000 is in sight. If clubs routinely make use of the "Grass Roots Fund" game opportunities, both in December, and in other "non-fund" months when you can run 1 extra masterpoint game for a "fund" we will be able to significantly boost the subsidies to our champions. The day when winning a trip actually means not having to pay to represent our District at an NABC now at hand. With your help, we'll soon be there.
