The Prez Says ...



George Jacobs, President of the United States Bridge Federation, welcomes you to the Buena Vista Palace in sunny Orlando, Florida, for the 2013 United States Bridge Championship.

There are 16 teams entered. Two have byes to the Quarterfinal. The Conditions of Contest call for the event to start with a 1.5 day Round Robin among the 6 lowest-

seeded teams. Four of those 6 teams advance to the Round of 16 to join the other 8 non-bye teams. The Round of 16 will last 1.5 days. After the Round of 16, the USA1 bracket will continue with 2 day Quarterfinal, Semi-Final and Final stages, concluding on Saturday, June 8th. The 6 losers from the Round of 16 will play in USA2. The two Round Robin losers have the choice of whether to play in USA2. Depending on the number of teams in USA2, the first stage of USA2 will be either a KO or a Round Robin to reduce to 4 teams opposite the USA1 Round of 8. The USA2 bracket will continue with 1 day KO matches on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, followed by 1.5 day KO Semi-Final and Final matches on Saturday, Sunday and Monday. USA1 losers will drop into USA2.

Besides the action at the tables, there is much to do in the area for Kibitzers and non-playing family members. For up-to-date information on all of this, plus hands and hand analysis during the event, be sure to read your Daily Bulletins.

For live coverage of the happenings, watch the VuGraph. Times and dates for sessions are on page 5 of this Pre-Bulletin.

Lisa Berkowitz and Molly O'Neill are planning warm, friendly hospitality during the event. For a chance to watch the events with friends in the suite, see page 8 for information.

Again, welcome to the United States Bridge Championship. We will do whatever we can to make your experience memorable. Good luck to the teams!

All About Kibitzing

WHEN CAN YOU KIBITZ IN THE PLAYING ROOMS?

You will be able to kibitz at any of the tables during this event, except in the Closed Room during the final sequestered matches of the Round Robin. However, you will be subject to the following regulations:

Kibitzers may enter the room ONLY at the start of play for a segment. Once play has started, the room will be closed.

A kibitzer who leaves the room may not return until the start of the next segment.

Cell phones and other electronic devices are not allowed in the playing rooms, even if they are turned off. Any kibitzer who is found with a cell phone wil be evicted and not allowed to kibitz during the remainder of the tournament.

When a match is being shown on BBO Vugraph, no kibitzer may sit on the same side of the table as the **Vugraph** operator.

SCREENS

All of the USBC is played with screens. If you've never kibitzed at a table with screens before, you need to know that it is quite different from kibitzing at a regular table. You need to be seated at an "open" corner of the table (not next to the screen) in order to see much, and once there are 4 kibitzers at a table it will be very hard for additional kibitzers to see.

USBC KIBITZING RULES

The USBF **General Conditions of Contest** contain specific rules about kibitzers. They are designed to promote security at the tournament and are set forth in the conditions of contest section labeled "Security." They are:

GENERAL RULES

- a. During any use of duplicated boards across multiple matches, Kibitzers must select one table for kibitzing and may not move to any other table during a session or segment.
- b. Kibitzers may not speak with players, must watch only one hand at a time, may not sit in such a position as to see more than one hand at a time, may not sit in such a position as to see a computer screen in use for Internet broadcast, must check communication devices with the Director, cannot call attention to irregularities other than a board being placed incorrectly on the table (arrow positioning), but may serve as witnesses to a possible irregularity.
- c. Kibitzers must enter the playing room before play commences. Kibitzers are required to remain until the segment of play is completed at the table they are watching or to leave the playing area entirely. Kibitzers are expected to abide by the same rules as the players regarding leaving the room (e.g. be escorted to the restroom).
- d. Except as expressly provided in these conditions and appendices, NPC's shall be subject to the WBF General Conditions, Section 17.
- e. No one other than the Internet broadcast personnel and Tournament Directors may watch any computer screen or any other mechanism for enabling the Internet broadcast at any time in either the Closed or the Open Room.
- f. These rules may be revised in specific instances by the DICs for the orderly running of the event.

Round Robin Schedule

Round Robin Information

The 2013 USBC Round Robin will be a 1.5-day complete Round Robin, with 16 board matches, scored using the USBF 16 board Victory Point scale (see left please).

Each match will be played in halves. Each player on every team must play at least half of the match against each other team.

On Friday, there will be 7 half matches. On Saturday, there will be 3 half matches.

SEQUESTERED MATCHES

The final two matches on Saturday will have the Closed Room sequestered. One pair on each team must play both matches in the Closed Room. No score comparison is allowed during these 2 matches.

For the first sequestered match, the NS pair at each table will be asked to complete a score sheet & have the EW pair verify that it is correct. We will pick up those score sheets and enter the scores into the computer in order to have your scores for that match completed by the time you finish the final match.

Those scores will be shown on a wall near the playing area. Players will be asked to confirm that those scores are correct when they turn in your score for the final match.

We hope that this procedure will help speed up the determination of which teams have qualified.

VuGraph Information

The 2013 USBC will be covered on BBO Vugraph starting with the Round of 16, in which we will probably cover 3 or 4 matches each session. The Round of 16 will start Saturday, June 1st at 3:45. From the Quarterfinals on, we will cover all of the USA1 tables in play. We will also cover the USA2, starting with the Round of 32.

To watch the Vugraph online, go to the BBO website where you can either log on directly from your browser, go to "Vugraph" and choose which table to watch or download the BBO software to run BBO on your computer. If you choose the latter approach, after downloading, install the software on your computer, log on, follow the directions to become a BBO member and you'll be magically transported to the Lobby of the largest bridge club in the world. Click on the button labeled VUGRAPH and you'll be able to choose which of the USBC matches you want to watch. To watch on your smartphone or tablet, go to: http://www.bridgebase.com/mobile/ and select the match you want to watch or install the BBO app and watch using that.

There will usually be a "yellow" user on BBO called USBF. If you have general questions, please ask USBF, not one of the hard-working Vugraph Operators, who may not have time to respond to private messages.

Each day's schedule is the same (these are Florida times; to see the times for your time-zone, go to the BBO Vugraph schedule site)

During the Semifinals and Finals for both brackets, all of the teams will play the same boards.

During the USA1 Round of 16, each team will play a different set of boards.

During the USA1 Quarterfinals, we don't know yet whether the physical set up will allow us to play the same boards in all matches.

After a session, you can review the Vugraph action on our Web Vugraphs, which show each hand played with a link to bidding and play records. Take a look at the older events currently available (under Archived Results) to see what we'll have for the 2013 USBC. Web Vugraphs are posted about half an hour after completion of the Vugraph show.

You can find the hand records for VG matches on the PSBRIDGE website at http://psbridge.gotdns.com/bbo/allvug/ as well as on the USBF site, linked to the scorecards you can get to by clicking on 2013USBC under "Event Results" in the upper left of each page.

No Electronic Devices are Permitted in the Playing Area.

This applies to players AND kibitzers.

Severe penalties will be assessed for violation of this rule. Please turn off all cell phones and check them at the door.

The USBF reserves the right to wand anyone entering the playing field.

The USBF Junior Training program holds weekly practices. Last month, Ruth Ng, a University of Chicago student, sitting North, found a great defense to take advantage of declarer's slip in the play.

Ruth got the defense off to a good start by leading her singleton ten of clubs. Declarer won the ace of clubs, cashed the ace of spades and crossed to his hand with the king of hearts. Now he had no quick entry to dummy, so he led a second round of trumps to Ruth's king.

Since declarer clearly had the heart suit for pitches and no more than one diamond trick was available to the defense, Ruth knew her side needed at least one club trick. She found the killing play, underleading her diamond ace, king, queen to partner's jack.

Partner was able to cash her king of clubs to defeat the hand.

Junior Online Training Program

In 2013, USBF initiated a training program for Juniors with international aspirations. Thanks to help from many USBF members who are serving as mentors, over 55 Juniors now practice on BBO each week. The Juniors are organized in groups of 4, and each group works with a regular mentor or sometimes two regular mentors. The groups play against other groups, so all of the players are exposed to a mentor other than their regular one. After the playing sessions, the groups and the mentor who watched their table discuss the hands, both online in BBO chat rooms and by email.

If you would like to kibitz any of the regular sessions, they are usually held on Thursday and Sunday evenings.



Harris will Q for the stage "Repargee" Minus 3 IMPs 3 times for slow play.

Picking 'gainst Robinson's only for fools! In this group of six, it's Robinson Rules! Rosenthal/Silverstein surely can play. They'll keep the others alive for a day.

Baseggio has a talented crew, With Schwartz and Stark and Lo, Lee, Gu.

Too bad for them ... they won't get past dawn... It's the consolation for Lowly Gu Gone!


Katz knew better than to reopen with double over his partner's trap pass. East/West would have escaped to a successful part-score or game in clubs. He knew better because he attended and participated in the April Ozdil-Katz School of Bridge lesson series on Negative Doubles!! And right they were!

Shane Blanchard was faced with an assortment of unsupported aces from which to lead. Nothing from his hand looked attractive. He hoped his partner was short in spades and led the spade ace. Indeed, his dad was short in the suit, however, declarer was also.

Seeing dummy, Shane realized that a spade continuation was futile. He shifted to the DJ. It turns out that he needed to shift to a club, tapping dummy and removing dummy's entry prematurely.

If Katz counters by leading the SK, Bob will ruff and Ralph will overruff. If Ralph now leads the H5 toward dummy, Shane can rise ace and stop declarer from reaching dummy in trumps. If declarer leads a high trump, Shane must duck, saving the trump ace to stop a dummy entry. On the actual diamond shift, Katz simply needed the H8 to fall.

Making ten tricks was worth 10.5 IMPs on Bridge Base!

Same night... same match... Shane led the spade four, Katz ducking to Bob's queen. Bob shifted to the club queen. Katz won in dummy with the ace, played king of hearts, queen of hearts, a heart to the ace and the nine to the ten, East pitching three clubs.


Katz cleared the ace and king of spades and led a club to the ten. The club king followed. He was at the crossroads.

Katz led the four of diamonds. At the table, Shane played the five, Dummy the 6, and Bob won his 9. East/West was helpless. Bob could cash his ace or underlead it and either way, Katz would score the diamond king.

Shane should have split his diamond honors because playing small, the position was hopeless. Katz could always duck and score a trick in diamonds. As the cards lie, however, it mattered not. With the T/8 over the 9 in diamonds, Katz would have made his contract regardless of Shane's play.

The defense could have done a trick better had Bob switched to anything other than a club at trick two, but it was too early to tell ... and if Shane had a club honor, a club shift would be a big winner. 7 IMPs to Nickell/Katz.

Roy opened an undisciplined weak two in second seat. Sabine, with five quick tricks including the AK of trump raised to game.

Looking at all four hands, it looks like declarer faces a loser in each suit. In point of fact, the defense took the expected number of tricks, but not the tricks expected.

Zia led the heart ten, ducked to Chip's king. Chip continued hearts. Roy won in dummy and cashed the two high trumps. He exited dummy with the heart seven, ruffed by Martel with the trump ten. A club at this point would probably have led to down two, however, from Martel's point of view (not seeing the KTx of diamonds in declarer's hand), the diamond queen looked superior. Roy won the diamond with the ace and played a diamond to the ten. He led the king of diamonds and Zia ruffed with the trump queen. An unavoidable loser in clubs resulted in down one.

At the other table, things went quite differently. Playing the contract from North left East with a variety of miserable leads. Marabelle chose the diamond queen which made the hand easy. Gunnar won the diamond in hand with the ace. He cashed his high spades and led a diamond to the ten. Hoping for a 3-3 split in spades, he played a spade from the dummy and was rewarded with his wish. He now had four spades, three diamonds and two round aces for nine tricks and 10 IMPs. A club lead would likely have resulted in down one for a push result.

Four hearts went down perforce on the lead of the singleton spade and a spade ruff. East won and played a club, and West waited for his two minor suit tricks.

In the other room, 3NT is much more interesting. Marabelle led her stiff spade. Claudia won with the ace and cleared the suit. It looked pretty good with her holding the ace of diamond and the king of clubs offside.

However, things are not always as they seem. Poor West was doomed on the run of the hearts. The first three pitches were easy: small diamonds. On the fifth heart, she pitched a spade... and on the sixth, she bared the king of clubs. North saw it coming and played a club to the ace for ten tricks and 12 IMPs.

Here is a hand with only three apparent losers: one spade, one diamond and one club... however, look what happened to poor Sally!

The opening lead was the king of clubs, followed by the club ace. Declarer ruffed the club ace, played a heart to the king, and ruffed a club from dummy. Next came the spade ace, spade king and a third spade won by North, south pitching a club. North exited a small trump, Declarer overtaking her nine with the queen in dummy to ruff another spade with the heart ace.

Oops... the last four cards in dummy are the H: J7 and the D: 96. The last four cards with North are the H: T and the D: Q82.

Declarer can now play the ace and another diamond, but South wins and plays a club to promote his partner's heart ten!! Down one and 9 IMPs to North/South!

Had declarer not overtaken the H9 with the honor in dummy, North would have won the diamond and played back his last trump. Now declarer would have been short a ruff to make the hand.

Had declarer played ace of diamonds and a diamond at tricks three and four, she could have made the hand. The communication between the East and West hands would not have been disintegrated.
