VuGraph Information

The 2015 USBC will be covered on BBO Vugraph starting with the Round of 16, in which we will cover 2 or 3 matches. The Round of 16 will start Sunday, May 10th. From the Quarterfinals on, we will cover all of the tables in play. To watch the Vugraph online, go to the **BBO website** where you can log on directly from your browser, go to "Vugraph" and choose which table to watch, or download the BBO software to run BBO on your computer. If you choose the latter approach, after downloading, install the software on your computer, log on, follow the directions to become a BBO member and you'll be magically transported to the Lobby of the largest bridge club in the world. Click on the button labeled VUGRAPH and you'll be able to choose which of the USBC matches you want to watch. There will often be a "yellow" user on BBO called USBF. If you have general questions, please ask USBF, not one of the hard-working Vugraph Operators, who may not have time to respond to private messages. Thank you.

Each day's schedule is the same (these are Chicago times; to see the times for your time-zone, go to the **BBO Vugraph schedule site**)

During the Semifinals and Finals, all of the teams will play the same boards.

During the Round of 16, each team will play a different set of boards.


After a session, you can review the Vugraph action on our Web Vugraphs, which show each hand played with a link to bidding and play records. Web Vugraphs are posted about half an hour after completion of the Vugraph show.

Doub and Borker bid very well to reach 6C.

The key bid in the auction was Borker's 4D call. This showed the best hand possible in support of clubs.

Doub reasoned that North was short in hearts since he likely would have bid 3H over 3D with his promised values and three card heart support.

The opening lead was the diamond ace. A second diamond was trumped. When the clubs split 2-2, Doub claimed.

At the other table in this match, West opened 3D and South balanced with double. North responded 3S and South corrected to 4H and played there making 450.

After a 1D opener, East can create a problem for South by responding 1H, South's best suit.

As it was, all's well that ends well for Borker!

Seeding Information

The teams in the USBC are seeded based on a combination of Individual Positioning Points & ACBL Performance Points, including masterpoints. The seeding points for an individual player are capped at 65. Teams are seeded based on the average seeding points for the team, except that the three teams with byes are seeded on the basis of their PPs. The teams and their seed positions are listed in the table below. Note that the top 4 finishers in the Round Robin receive additional seeding points, which may change the seeding order for the Knockout stage. Teams may also add or drop players before the USBC, which would change their seeding points.

The hospitality suite will be open for Vugraph, casual chit chat, drinks & snacks during the rest of the playing hours and for a short time after the end of the day.



Pulling the Woolsey Over Their Eyes...

Kit Woolsey believes in aggressive, unorthodox preempting. Backing up his belief, he opened a multi 2D (weak two in either major) holding the H: QT542! (At least he wasn't vulnerable...)

Stewart's 2NT asked which suit Kit held. Since N/S can make 3NT, 4H doubled down two would not be a disaster... it would actually be a good save.

Caught up in the spirit of the auction, Woolsey passed over 3C, momentarily forgetting this was conventional showing spades. When asked by RHO, he realized the error of his ways. He responded that it showed spades and hoped for the best. Stewart knowing nothing of the misbid, happily bid 4S.

Look at the hand from South's perspective. Gupta has defense against 4S and should probably double. Not realizing what was happening, she rebid her seven card club suit.

Woolsey would have doubled on almost anything to stop the trainwreck. In this case, luck was with him. He led a spade



Traditionalists believe that a 3H bid at favorable vulnerability shows a six trick hand. Aggressive preemptors are willing to go down four tricks. Zach Grossack made the ultimate preempt when he opened 3H on a hand with TEN losers!

Adam could have redoubled over the double; he could have bid four diamonds (lead directing). In the end, he opted to simply bid the four heart game. Given the strength of his hand, he did not expect the opponents would bid any more .

South surprised him by bidding four spades. Adam chose to defend, but surprisingly didn't double. Hearts were led and four spades was defeated one trick.
