

## The Prez Says ...

Welcome to the First Ever 2020 USBF Invitational 1 Online Tournament. We are excited to present this event... entirely online for spectators' and players' enjoyment during this pandemic lockdown. 12 top United States teams are set to compete.

There will be 4 stages: a 2 day Round Robin on Saturday & Sunday and one day Quarterfinal, Semifinal and Final KO matches on Monday, Tuesday & Wednesday.

Team Nickell (Nickell, Katz, Levin, Weinstein, Rodwell and Meckstroth) and team Spector (Spector, Kranyak, Wolpert, Hurd, Demuy, and Wooldridge) have byes to the Round of 8.

For the Quarterfinal, Nickell will be assigned bracket position 1; Spector will be assigned bracket position 2; the Round Robin winner will be assigned bracket position 3 and have the right to choose its Quarterfinal opponent from the teams that finished 4th through 6th in the Round Robin. The teams that finished second & third may make themselves available to be chosen. If they were not chosen by the Round Robin winner, the 2nd and 3rd place Round Robin teams will be randomly assigned bracket positions 4 and 5, and the remaining Round Robin teams will be randomly assigned bracket positions 7 & 8.

The event will be "open notes" - players may consult their notes during bidding and play. If a table exceeds the allotted time for a RR match or KO segment and one of the players has spent a significant amount of time consulting his or her notes, that player's team will be deemed at fault for the tardiness.

Undo's may be requested for misclicks. The request must be made before the partner of the player who is asking for the undo has acted. The opponents must allow the undo.

Online play presents its own challenges. The USBF extends its gratitude to BBO for providing a venue for bridge to thrive during this difficult time. While the USBF Board and the tournament organizers do their best to make our events the fairest Competitions year after year, maintaining this standard is your responsibility as players. We count on you to uphold the high ideals of ethics, camaraderie and sportsmanship for which United States bridge is known worldwide.

I know I will do my part to uphold these standards. Please keep this in mind as you participate in this event.

## Vugraph... Special "PANDEMIC" instructions...

The **2020 USBF Invitational 1** will be covered on BBO Vugraph starting with the Quarterfinals. All of the matches will be listed in the BBO Vugraph Theatre.

To watch the Vugraph online, go to the **BBO website**, log on to BBO, go to "Vugraph" and choose which match to watch. To watch on your smartphone or tablet, install the BBO app and watch using that.

The tables listed in the Vugraph Theatre are not real Vugraph tables, just links to actual tables on BBO where the players are playing. What you will see once you click on a "Vugraph" table is the same thing you would see if you got to the BBO table by searching for your favorite player and clicking on "join" on his or her profile. This means that some things are different from a normal Vugraph table:

1. We aren't able to load a starting score for segments after the first one. Instead, we will be putting the score from previous quarters in the Vugraph Theatre list, and will put (+##) after the name of the leading team in the score box to show how much that team was ahead at the start of the session. You will be able to determine the "real" running score by adding the score shown in the score box to the score after the +.
2. We do not have to have both tables "on Vugraph" to let you choose which table to watch. We only have 4 special Vugraph operators who can set up the links from the Vugraph Theatre to the tables in play. So for the Quarterfinal we will list one table from each match. To get to the other table, click on the blue "hamburger" menu in the upper right of the screen where the hands are shown and select "Other Table."
3. The names you see are the players' BBO names, but all of them will have their real names in the profile you can get by clicking on their name.
4. We will not have the usual pop ups with player pictures and links to convention cards. Instead, each pair has prepared a BBO convention card with links to the pair's USBF System Summary Form and either filled in the BBO convention card or provided a link to an electronic convention card. You can get to the BBO convention card using the hamburger menu, and to the linked system information by selecting the appropriate URL and either copying it and pasting it into a new tab or window, or right-clicking on it and going to it in a new tab or window (the links are not clickable).

There will often be a "yellow" user on BBO called USBF. If you have general questions, please ask USBF, although she will also be dealing with tournament issues and may not respond promptly.

Each day's schedule is the same (these are Eastern US times; to see the times for your time-zone, go to the **BBO Vugraph schedule site**)



# Some Suggestions For Your Nearby Dining Pleasure (Home?) Pandemic Pleasures...

## DoubleTree Signature Cookie Recipe *Makes 26 cookies*

½ pound butter, softened (2 sticks)  
¾ cup + 1 tablespoon granulated sugar  
¾ cup packed light brown sugar  
2 large eggs  
1 ¼ teaspoons vanilla extract  
¼ teaspoon freshly squeezed lemon juice  
2 ¼ cups flour  
1/2 cup rolled oats  
1 teaspoon baking soda  
1 teaspoon salt  
Pinch cinnamon  
2 2/3 cups Nestle Tollhouse semi-sweet chocolate chips  
1 3/4 cups chopped walnuts



**Cream butter, sugar and brown sugar in the bowl of a stand mixer on medium speed for about 2 minutes.**

**Add eggs, vanilla and lemon juice, blending with mixer on low speed for 30 seconds, then medium speed for about 2 minutes, or until light and fluffy, scraping down bowl.**

**With mixer on low speed, add flour, oats, baking soda, salt and cinnamon, blending for about 45 seconds. Don't overmix.**


**Remove bowl from mixer and stir in chocolate chips and walnuts.**

**Portion dough with a scoop (about 3 tablespoons) onto a baking sheet lined with parchment paper about 2 inches apart.**

**Preheat oven to 300°F. Bake for 20 to 23 minutes, or until edges are golden brown and center is still soft.**

**Remove from oven and cool on baking sheet for about 1 hour.**

**Cook's note: You can freeze the unbaked cookies, and there's no need to thaw. Preheat oven to 300°F and place frozen cookies on parchment paper-lined baking sheet about 2 inches apart. Bake until edges are golden brown and center is still soft.**



# Pineapple Whip...

For one serving, blend together 1 scoop of ice cream (we're assuming vanilla), 4 oz. pineapple juice, and 2 cups frozen pineapple chunks in a blender until smooth, then recreate the iconic swirl. Voila!

## GRILLED THREE-CHEESE SANDWICH

From Woody's Lunch Box  
at Disney's Hollywood Studios

### INGREDIENTS

SERVES 4

#### Cream Cheese Spread

- 1/2 cup cream cheese
- 1/2 cup shredded Double Gloucester or cheddar
- 2 tablespoons heavy cream
- 1/4 teaspoon coarse salt

#### Garlic Spread

- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1 1/2 teaspoons minced garlic
- 1/2 teaspoon coarse salt

#### Grilled Three-Cheese Sandwich

- 8 slices of artisan bread
- 8 cheddar cheese slices
- 8 provolone slices

### DIRECTIONS

#### For Cream Cheese Spread

Combine cream cheese, Double Gloucester or cheddar, heavy cream, and salt in food processor. Blend until smooth. Set aside.

#### For Garlic Spread

Combine mayonnaise, garlic, and salt in small bowl and stir until blended. Set aside.

#### For Grilled Three-Cheese Sandwich

1. Lay out artisan bread slices on parchment paper or large cutting board.
2. Place 2 slices of cheddar on 4 of the bread slices. Place 2 slices of provolone on remaining bread slices.
3. Equally spoon cream cheese spread on slices with provolone. Gently smooth cream cheese spread over each slice.
4. Press cheddar side and provolone side together.
5. Heat a large skillet over medium heat for 5 minutes, until hot.
6. Brush both sides of the sandwiches with garlic spread.
7. Grill sandwiches for 2 minutes on each side, until cheese is melted and bread is golden brown.

## CANADIAN CHEDDAR CHEESE SOUP

From Le Cellier Steakhouse at EPCOT®



### INGREDIENTS

SERVES 10

- 1/2 pound of bacon, cut into 1/2-inch pieces
- 1 medium red onion, cut into 1/4-inch pieces
- 3 celery ribs, cut into 1/4-inch pieces
- 4 tablespoons butter
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 3 cups chicken stock
- 4 cups milk
- 1 pound white cheddar cheese, grated
- 1 tablespoon Tabasco sauce
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- Coarse salt, freshly ground pepper to taste
- 1/2 cup warm Canadian golden lager or any pale lager-style beer
- Chopped scallions or chives, for garnish

### DIRECTIONS

1. In a 4- or 5-quart Dutch oven, cook bacon, stirring, over medium heat for about 5 minutes, or until lightly browned.
2. Add red onion, celery, and butter and sauté until the onion has softened, about 5 minutes.
3. Add flour and cook, stirring constantly, for about 4 minutes over medium heat. Whisk in chicken stock and bring to a boil for 1 minute. Reduce heat to a simmer and cook for 15 minutes, stirring occasionally.
4. Add milk and continue to simmer for 15 minutes. Do not boil after milk is added.
5. Remove from heat and add cheese, Tabasco sauce, Worcestershire sauce, salt, and pepper. Blend with immersion blender until cheese is melted and soup is smooth. Stir in warm beer. If the soup is too thick, thin with some warm milk.
6. Serve the soup hot, garnished with chopped scallions or chives.

## Chocolate, Peanut Butter, Banana French Toast

from Disney's PCH Grill  
at Disney's Paradise Pier Hotel



### PLAYING IN HEARTS!!

How many brain cells  
Do you think I'm burning  
While weighing the odds  
And being discerning?

### INGREDIENTS

**SERVES 4**

- 8 thick slices day-old challah bread
- 2 ripe bananas
- 1/4 cup chocolate chips
- 1/2 cup creamy peanut butter
- 6 eggs, lightly beaten
- 3/4 cup low-fat chocolate milk
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- Chocolate syrup and powdered sugar, optional

### DIRECTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 350°F. Coat a 9x13x2-inch baking pan with nonstick spray. Set aside.
2. Cut bread into 1-inch cubes and place in a large bowl. Slice bananas into 1/2-inch slices, and add to bowl. Stir in chocolate chips.
3. Combine peanut butter, eggs, chocolate milk, cinnamon, and salt in a blender. Process until smooth.
4. Pour egg mixture over bread mixture. Stir gently until bread cubes have absorbed egg mixture.
5. Pour mixture into prepared baking pan. Bake for 35 to 40 minutes, or until top is golden brown.
6. Before serving, drizzle with chocolate syrup and dust with powdered sugar, if desired.

### CHEF'S NOTES

Challah is traditional Jewish yeast bread, rich with eggs, sweetened with honey that makes the best French toast.

## TONGA TOAST

at Disney's Polynesian Village Resort



### INGREDIENTS

**SERVES 4**

#### SUGAR-CINNAMON

- 3/4 cup granulated sugar
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon

#### BATTER

- 4 large eggs
- 1 1/3 cup whole milk
- 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 tablespoon granulated sugar

#### TONGA TOAST

- 1 quart canola oil, for frying
- 1 loaf sourdough bread (uncut, 12 inches long)
- 2 large bananas, peeled

### DIRECTIONS

#### FOR SUGAR-CINNAMON:

Mix sugar and cinnamon in medium bowl (large enough to roll toast) with a fork until thoroughly blended. Set aside.

#### FOR BATTER:

Whip eggs in medium bowl (large enough to dip toast) until well beaten. Add milk, cinnamon, and sugar. Mix well and set aside.

#### FOR TONGA TOAST:

1. Using caution, preheat oil to 350°F in a large pot or a deep fryer. (If using a large pot, use a candy thermometer to make certain the oil does not get any hotter or it will burn.)
2. Slice the bread into four three-inch-thick slices.
3. Cut each banana in half crosswise, then each piece lengthwise.
4. Place a bread slice flat on the counter and tear out just enough from the middle (do not tear all the way through) to stuff half a banana into; repeat with each bread slice.
5. Dip stuffed bread into batter, covering both sides, allowing excess batter to drip off bread and place carefully into hot oil.
6. Cook 4-5 minutes until golden brown. If needed, turn toast over after 2 minutes and cook for another 2 minutes on other side. Remove and drain excess oil.
7. Roll toast in cinnamon-sugar. Repeat for each piece of toast.

Justin started playing professionally, and at age 20 he moved from Dallas to New York. Justin has a wealth of experience playing at the highest levels as well as teaching players of all levels. His passion for bridge is clearly shown every time he plays.

At age 24, Justin was the youngest player on the youngest team ever to win the USBF Open Team Trials.

In the Bermuda Bowl, he won the silver medal, being the youngest player on the youngest team by average age. He now has six NABC+ wins, beginning with the GNT Championship Flight in 2006.

When Meckstroth came in freely with 2S in response to the takeout double, it was even more likely that Madala had stretched to open.

Madala, on lead against East, led the DK. Meckstroth won with the ace, played the ace and queen of spades and ruffed a diamond to his hand. He cashed the SK, shedding the CT from dummy. He crossed to the CA and cross-ruffed for 13 tricks. +1010.

At the other table, Katz passed in third seat. Rizzo opened 2NT on his 22HCP. Lucena bid puppet Stayman and Rizzo showed at least one four card major. Lucena showed 5S and 4H with his 3S bid. Rizzo's 4C cue was doubled by Nickell and Lucena's 4D cue was doubled by Katz. Rizzo bid 4H and Lucena happily passed on his five count.

Nickell, on lead against West, led the D5. Rizzo won, pulled two rounds of trump and cashed the ace and queen of spades. He pulled trump. He claimed 12 tricks. +480

11 IMPs to Nickell

Light third seat openers have become so commonplace, their effectiveness has diminished. It is still intriguing when opening ahead of the "big" hand results in the opponents bidding slam... and passing ahead of the "big" hand results in the opps bidding game.

Nickell and Katz's doubles of the cue bids put just enough doubt in the opponents' minds to keep them out of slam.



1. Enter the fantasy brackets, run on Bridge Winners, for the USBF trials choosing our Open and Senior teams for the World Championships. The highest-ranking Supporting Member in the fantasy brackets for each of these two events will win the prize of your choice - either an online match against the USBC winners or dinner with them at the next NABC.
2. Receive daily emails during the USBF Championships. These will summarize the previous day's results and provide vugraph information and links to daily bulletins containing pictures and commentary on individual hands.
3. Upon advanced request, make arrangements for you to kibitz a USBF member of your choice for a session once each year – either at an NABC or the USBF Championships.
4. Upon advanced request, we will arrange for you to be one of the vugraph commentators for one session of the team trials.

A Supporting Membership is \$25 for one year (\$75 for 3 years) and the ACBL now offers you the chance to become an USBF Supporting Member when you renew your ACBL membership. If you don't want to wait that long, you can join by choosing the red Donate Now button on the USBF website. Your donation will be used to cover inevitable expenses: attorney fees, accounting fees, website support services, tournament directors, insurance, WBF dues, and vugraph operators. The USBF is an all-volunteer organization. Our meetings are by conference call and at NABCS. ## 2020 USBCs CANCELLED

Although the WBF has not scheduled the 2021 World Championship, they have announced that there will be only one World Championship in 2021. It will be held in the late summer in Salsomaggiore, Italy. The USBF Board has therefore cancelled the scheduled 2020 USBCs. We expect to hold 2021 USBCs in May of 2021 to select the teams for whatever World Championship the WBF schedules. *The plan (still to be ratified) is to hold the Bermuda Bowl in 2021 and the World Bridge Games in 2022.*

Captains of teams that were entered in the 2020 USBCs should have received an email telling them of the cancellation and that they can either move their entry to 2021 or receive a full refund of their entry fee. Byes to the 2021 Open USBC will almost certainly be based on team performance in the 2019 USBC, Spingold, Soloway, and Reisinger, and the 2020 Soloway, and Reisinger and 2021 Vanderbilt, if those events are held.

For new teams, the entry pages for the 2021 USBCs will be online soon at the USBF website: [usbf.org](http://usbf.org). Closing date for guaranteed entries is currently March 31, 2021. By then we should have firm dates for the events and will adjust those dates appropriately.

Nickell led the HJ. Levin won in dummy. He played a club to the ace and king and cashed the HA, discarding a spade from Kokish's hand. A spade followed, won by Nickell with the ace. The HT gave Levin a ruff and sluff. Levin ruffed in dummy and discarded a long spade. Levin led the C5. He was at the crossroads. He ruffed with the DJ. This play failed because diamonds are 4-0. A chance that occurs 9.6% of the time.

*(Note that it can also fail when clubs break 4-2 and one opponent holds Txx in the trump suit.)*

Levin's play was reasonable. Unlucky for him, the clubs were 3-3 and trumps were 4-0.

Kokish, affectionately referred to as "Koach" proved a challenging opponent and a fun night was had by all!
