### **Kibitzing the OCBL in Real Time...**

Several of the pairs in this USBF event are also playing in the many other Pandemic online team events. Some play with their same teammates and others play with different teammates from near and from far.

The Tuesday VuGraph sessions (in real time) had some interesting hands.



On Board 9, Zia and Naren Gupta played against Lasse Aaseng and Arve Farstad from Norway. The Norwegians found the impermeable minor suit game. Naren led the DK and when that held, he tried the DA ruffed by declarer. Aaseng knocked out the CA and claimed his 11 tricks for +600.

At the other table, Naren and Zia's teammates found the heart game from East. This proved unlucky for them when South led his singleton club. North won and gave his partner a ruff. A diamond followed to the king and another club ruff for down!

12 IMPs to the Norwegians

Note that if Lasseaa had bid 4H instead of 5C, he might still have been successful with North on lead. Whichever the contract, Naren was more likely to lead a high diamond from his diamond holding than to have led the unsupported CA on a whim.



After you select Kibitz JLall Online Teams #3, you will be taken to a lobby where you will see a list of tables on the left and a chat box and list of people in the lobby on the right. The table listing shows the team & player names at each table, as well as the board and trick that table is playing (that's in the middle of the table, immediately under the table number). Click on a table to kibitz it.

At the table, you will see a hand diagram, and the bidding and play as it happens. You do not get to hear or see the players yet (that's coming).

There is a chat window on the right of the screen (if your browser window isn't large enough to show it, you can click on the "chat" icon immediately above the UNDO button to open the chat window. For now, anyone can type chat into the chat window.

Some things you can do to get more information:

If there is an asterisk next to a bid, that means it was Alerted or Explained. Click on the bid to see the explanation if there was one.

- -- "Rewind" the play using the slider underneath the "table" with hand diagram. just move the vertical handle on the slider to the left to go to earlier tricks.
- -- Click on the "Scores" button to the left of the South player's name, you will get a scorecard for the match so far. You can use this to get lots of information:
- ----Click on a board number to see the hand record and results at all the tables.
- ----You can also click on a number in a yellow box to get to the hand record from some screens.
- ----In the hand record screen, click on a result to see the bidding and play at a specific table.
- --In the upper left corner:
- ----Click on the yellow box with 4 little boxes to get the match scores for all the matches (that will be IMPs and for the Round Robin will not include scores from previous rounds).
- ----Click on the yellow box with 3 bulleted lines to get Cross-IMPs for the pairs (that will be just for this match).

The Scores information is also available in the lobby using the button at the upper right in case you want to check on scores before deciding which table to watch.

TIMING OF DELAY

The Round Robin matches will be delayed until each round is completed.

The first half KO matches will be delayed until each board has been played at all tables, so there may sometimes be a period when nothing new is being shown because one or two tables are slow to play the board. For the second half of the KO matches, the delay will be until the quarter has been completed. That means that the 3rd quarter kibitzing will start at 7:15 EDT.

### **USBF News...**

#### USBCs POSTPONED

Although the WBF has not yet officially postponed the 2021 World Championships, the EBL has canceled the 2021 European Team Championship because of travel restrictions in Europe that are expected to continue through the summer. The USBF does not expect to be sending teams to a World Championship in August, 2021, and has therefore postponed the USBF Selection Trials (USBCs).

We do not know when the WBF will hold the 2021 World Championships, so it is difficult to establish dates for the USBCs that would give the qualified teams time to make plans and also have the USBCs as late as possible, when more people will be vaccinated.

We recognize that people need to make plans even in these uncertain times.

Therefore, we will hold the face-to-face stages of the USBCs either in August or October, unless the WBF completely cancels the 2021 World Championships.

As soon as we have had an opportunity to discuss space availability with our host hotel in Schaumburg, IL, we will post proposed schedules for August and October face-to-face stages, recognizing that only one set of dates will apply.

We will also post starting dates for online stages, if those are needed.

Entry deadlines for the 2021 USBCs have all been extended to July 1. If the face-to-face stages are held in October, the entry deadlines will be further extended.

Thank you all for your patience with the uncertainties of this. We wish we knew more. We will update you as updates become available.





On April 6th in the OCBL tournament on BBO, Board 10 provided excitement in the Hill/Wilson match.

At one table, Luctijs opened a first seat weak two in hearts on his poor 6 card suit headed by the T9. Shan Huang, with great heart cards, overcalled 2NT on his 17 count with the singleton ace of spades. 3C was a relay to 3D and 3S was to play. Verhees balanced with a double over 3S. North and East passed leaving Shan to reopen with redouble hoping for a better spot. Dwyer sought cover in 4D and Verhees ended the auction with a double.

4D was cold if declarer plays West for the HK and goes into a spade/club crossruff.

Verhees led the DK, won with declarer's ace. Declarer ruffed a club in dummy, and believing the weak two heart opener, declarer finessed against the HK, losing to Verhees. When Verhees cashed the DQ and played his last diamond, declarer found himself one trick short. Shan won in his hand, ruffed a club in dummy and played a heart to his ace. He cashed the HJ and conceded a club to West. Verhees exited with the S6 to declarer's ace. Another club was conceded and the contract failed one trick.

At the other table, East did not choose a weak two. He passed and South opened 1C. This time West overcalled 1NT; North passed; and East Texas transferred to 4H. South doubled the game.

Van Prooijen led the spade deuce (looking for a club ruff) to the seven, ace and jack (a random false card). Alison Wilson cashed the DA so partner would return spades after ruffing a club. By doing that, she scored all three of her heart tricks while her partner scored two club ruffs to defeat the hand 4 tricks for 1100!

# Some Suggestions For Dining at Home Between Sessions! Pandemic Pleasures...

#### **Loaded Huevos Rancheros with Roasted Poblano Peppers**

#### **Ingredients**

- 1 poblano pepper
- 1/2 pound fresh chorizo or bulk spicy pork sausage
- 4 cups frozen O'Brien potatoes, thawed
- 1/2 cup shredded pepper jack cheese
- 1 teaspoon smoked paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 4 large eggs
- Salsa, sour cream and minced fresh cilantro

















#### **Directions**

- Place poblano pepper in a 12-in. cast-iron or other ovenproof skillet. Broil 4 in. from heat until skin blisters, rotating with tongs until all sides are blistered and blackened, about 5 minutes. Immediately place pepper in a small bowl; let stand, covered, 20 minutes.
- Peel off and discard charred skin. Remove stems and seeds. Finely chop pepper; set aside.
- In the same skillet, cook chorizo over medium heat until cooked through, 6-8 minutes, breaking into crumbles; drain. Add potatoes; cook and stir until potatoes are tender, 8-10 minutes. Stir in cheese, smoked paprika, kosher salt, garlic powder and pepper.
- With the back of a spoon, make 4 wells in potato mixture. Break an egg in each well. Cook, covered, on medium-low until egg whites are completely set and yolks begin to thicken but are not hard, 5-7 minutes. Serve with roasted pepper, salsa, sour cream and cilantro.

#### **Tips**

Make it a full meal with a side of bacon and one of these breakfast bread recipes on the side.

We recommend making this recipe in our 12-inch cast-iron skillet.



# South of the Border Scrambled Eggs

#### **Ingredients**

- 1 tablespoon canola oil
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 1/4 cup chopped sweet red pepper
- 1 jalapeno pepper, seeded and chopped
- 8 bacon strips, cooked and crumbled
- 8 large eggs, lightly beaten
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese, divided
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon pepper
- Salsa



#### **Directions**

• In a large cast-iron or other heavy skillet, heat oil over medium-high heat. Add onion and pepper; cook and stir until tender, 3-5 minutes. Sprinkle with bacon. Pour eggs over the top; sprinkle with 1/2 cup cheese, salt and pepper. Cook over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until eggs are completely set. Sprinkle with remaining cheese. Serve with salsa.

#### Tip:

Wear disposable gloves when cutting hot peppers; the oils can burn skin. Avoid touching your face.

- 4 large egg whites
- 2 large eggs
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 2 corn tortillas (6 inches), halved and cut into strips
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh spinach
- 2 tablespoons shredded reduced-fat cheddar cheese
- 1/4 cup salsa



- In a large bowl, whisk egg whites, eggs and pepper. Stir in tortillas, spinach and cheese.
- Heat a large skillet coated with cooking spray over medium heat. Pour in egg mixture; cook and stir until eggs are thickened and no liquid egg remains. Top with salsa.





Had De Wijs led a club to his partner's ace, 6S would have suffered the same fate as 6NT, however, leading a side singleton against a slam generally works best.
