To kibitz, go to [the RealBridge kibitzing website](#), enter your name and click on Log In. That will take you to a screen where you can select the event to kibitz.

After you select Kibitz JLall Online Teams #5, you will be taken to a lobby with a list of tables on the left and a chat box and list of people on the right. The table listing shows the team & player names at each table, as well as the board being played. There will be information about the number of kibitzers and whether there is audio/video commentary (a picture of a TV means there is). Click on a table to kibitz it.

At the table, you will see a hand diagram, and the bidding and play as it happened.

There is a chat window on the right of the screen. You can type chat into the chat window.

Some things you can do to get more information:

If there is an asterisk next to a bid, that means it was Alerted/Explained. Click on the bid to see the explanation.

-- "Rewind" using the slider underneath the "table." Move the handle to the left to go to earlier tricks.

-- Click on the "Scores" button to the left of the South player's name to get a scorecard for the match.

----Click on a board number to see the hand record and results at all of the tables.

----You can also click on a number in a yellow box to get to the hand record from some screens.

----In the hand record screen, click on a result to see the bidding and play at a specific table.

--In the upper left corner:

----Click on the yellow box with 4 little boxes to get the match scores for all the matches (that will be IMPs and for the Round Robin will not include scores from previous rounds).

----Click on the yellow box with 3 bulleted lines to get Cross-IMPs for the pairs (that will be just for this match).

The Scores information is also available in the lobby using the button at the upper right should you want to check on scores before deciding which table to watch.

## TIMING OF DEFERRAL

The Round Robin matches will be deferred until each round is completed.

The first half KO matches will be deferred for half an hour or until each board has been played at all tables, so there may sometimes be a period when nothing new is being shown because one or two tables are very slow to play the board. **For the second half of the KO matches, the delay will be until the quarter is scheduled to be completed, so players will not be able to get useful state of match information. That means that the 3rd quarter kibitzing will start at 6:25 EST.**



On Monday, we showcased Board 23 on pages 17 and 18. It was a tough hand from both the standpoint of the defense and the offensive. We included stories from several tables but not all...

After reading his Sunday bulletin, Jerry Clerkin shared what happened at his table and it is well worth sharing here:

Jerry led the CT against 3NT... as did several others. Aker won the queen in dummy and played a small heart to his queen. **Clerkin played his HJ!!!** Jerry hoped his partner held the HT and he could create an entry to Hinton's hand to get a spade through the Kx.

Aker abandoned hearts!

He tried three rounds of diamonds ending in dummy and played towards his SK for a ninth trick.

The defense cashed out its spades and defeated the hand one trick.


Jerry wrote, "I think he should have tried clubs and diamonds first and then led up to the heart K. If RHO has the A10 of hearts, Aker will still get a chance to play on spades and can try the K then..."

In the discussion, Jerry adds that he doesn't think "many would figure all that out at the table."

Both Bishel and Lusky made it into RR2. Luckily for Clerkin, they won't play the teams that were in their early bracket in the second RoundRobin.

False cards don't work as well when the opponents know you use them!

# Meet the Players!



**Eldad "Gino" Ginossar**, originally from Israel, is now living in Chicago, where his wife is teaching at the University of Chicago. Eldad and his wife share an adorable young son.

Ginossar, born June 14, 1981, is a professional bridge player and author. He won the European Open Teams Championship in Antalya, Turkey, in June, 2007, in partnership with Ron Pachtman with teammates, Michel and Thomas Bessis.

Ginossar won both the Israeli Open pairs Championship and the Israeli Interface Message Processor Pairs Championship in 2007, completing an unprecedented series of victories in a single year.

His greatest achievement in a world championship is 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the Rosenblum Cup in 2006.

Gino considers his greatest accomplishment winning the Mixed Championship in Israel 2 years in a row.

In 2011, Eldad explained that like some other young bridge professionals, he is taking the scenic route towards his college degree. At that time he was in the middle of his 7th year towards a BA in philosophy and history. Perhaps he has finished by now??

Eldad is a great contributor to the Chicago Duplicate Bridge Club, giving lessons and lectures and giving a portion of the sales of his book, *Power Up Your Bridge Game*, to the club.

He must be missed in Israel because is very much appreciated in Chicago!!

Pre-Pandemic, Eldad was awarded Chicago Bridge's highest award: The Harmon Wilkes Award. This award is not given annually, only when a deserving candidate is selected. It is given to a local player who contributes above and beyond to the game, who exhibits exemplary bridge skills and exceptional ethics.

At all ten tables in Round Robin 2, South opened 1NT and became the declarer in 3NT on Board 5. At all but one table, North bid Stayman and South denied a major. Most West players led the H5 and declarer had the timing to bring home nine tricks.

In the Donner/Lusky match, Brad Moss and Joe Grue employed a system that allowed North to fully describe his hand, while declarer's hand could only be inferred.

Walter Lee listened carefully to the auction and found the killing lead. Since South was willing to play 3NT opposite a singleton or void club, leading from West's strong club holding could easily blow a trick. Similarly, leading either major would be dangerous.

Lee led the D8 (second from top in a weak suit). Merblum (East) encouraged with the D5 and declarer won the DQ. Moss played the HK, ducked around. Moss continued with the HJ and overtook with dummy's queen. The S6 was led from dummy. Merblum covered with the seven. Declarer inserted the jack and Lee won the king. Lee continued with the DT. Dummy played the king. Merblum completed the echo, playing the three.

Moss played the HT from dummy. Lee won the ace and continued diamonds, finessing dummy's jack. Merblum cashed two diamonds and exited with a club. With the club king offside and spades not breaking, declarer was forced to concede the setting trick.

At the other table in this match, Lusky/Falk used a Puppet Stayman auction to reach 3NT.

Sandra Rimstedt also found the D8 lead. Her partner, Gary Donner, followed with the D3 (UDCA). Lusky won the queen and played the HK. Rimstedt won the ace and switched to the CK!!

Lusky collected nine tricks, scoring +600.

# Some Suggestions For Dining at Home Between Sessions! Pandemic Pleasures...

## Russian Blini

### Ingredients

#### CRÊPES

- 1½ C (166 g) unbleached flour
- 1 C (170 g) buckwheat flour
- 1 tsp (5 g) salt
- 2 tsp (6 g) active dry yeast
- ½ C (118 g) milk, warmed (80–100°F / 26–38°C)
- 4 tsp (19 g) unsalted butter, melted and slightly cooled
- 2 lg eggs, separated
- ¼ C (57 g) unsalted butter for frying

### Directions

#### CRÊPES

Place flours, salt and yeast in a bowl, stirring to combine. Make a well in center; add milk. Mix until smooth; cover and proof about 1 hour. Stir in melted butter and egg yolks. Beat egg whites until stiff; fold in. Cover and let stand for 20 minutes. Melt some of butter in a nonstick skillet on medium high, dropping quarter-sized amounts of dough into skillet. Cook on 1 side about 1 minute; flip and cook for 30 seconds more, cooking a few at a time until batter is finished.

#### PLATING

Serve with caviar or smoked salmon, garnished with chopped hard-boiled eggs, minced onion, crème fraîche and dill.




# Creamy Cognac Prawns

## Ingredients

- 1 Tbsp (14 g) unsalted butter
- 1 Tbsp (13 g) olive oil
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- ½ C (120 g) shallots, thinly sliced
- 1 lb (0.5 kg) prawns, peeled & deveined
- Pinch red pepper flakes
- ¼ C (38 g) sundried tomatoes, packed in oil, drained & diced
- ½ C (118 ml) Cognac
- ½ C (118 ml) half-and-half
- Salt and pepper to taste



## Directions

Heat butter and olive oil in a skillet over medium heat. Add garlic and shallots and cook, stirring frequently, until golden. Increase heat to high; add prawns, red pepper flakes and sundried tomatoes and cook, stirring frequently, for 5 minutes or until shrimp is opaque and lightly golden. Transfer shrimp to a plate; cover to keep warm. Increase heat to high; add Cognac, stirring to loosen browned bits from bottom. Reduce heat to low and stir in half-and-half. Let simmer for 5 minutes or until sauce is slightly thickened. Fold in shrimp and serve immediately over pasta or rice.

- **Cook time: 15 minutes.**

# Salad Nicoise

## Ingredients

### VINAIGRETTE

- 1½ Tbsp (23 g) shallots, minced
- 1 Tbsp (16 g) Dijon mustard
- ½ tsp (2.5 g) salt
- ½ tsp (2.3 g) fresh ground pepper
- 1 Tbsp (15 ml) fresh lemon juice
- 1 Tbsp (15 ml) red wine vinegar
- ⅔ C (144–177 ml) extra virgin olive oil

### SALAD

- ¾ lb (340 g) fresh green beans, blanched; still warm
- 1 sm red onion, thinly sliced
- 6 med Roma tomatoes, cut into wedges
- 6 sm potatoes, cooked and cut into wedges
- 1 head butter lettuce, coarsely chopped
- 2 3-oz (85-g) cans chunk white tuna, preferably oil-packed
- 6 lg eggs, hardboiled and cut into wedges
- 1 2-oz (56-g) can flat anchovy fillets
- 2 oz (56 g) small black brine-cured olives
- 3 Tbsp (26 g) capers, rinsed
- ¼ C (15 g) flat leaf parsley, minced

## Directions

### VINAIGRETTE

Place all ingredients in lidded jar; shake to combine.

### SALAD

Place green beans, onion, tomatoes, potatoes, and 4 T (13.5 g) of the vinaigrette in a large bowl; toss gently. Divide lettuce among 4 shallow bowls; spoon salad mixture over lettuce. Arrange tuna, egg and olives on top and add capers, parsley and anchovy. Drizzle remaining vinaigrette over each bowl.

- **Prep time: 35 minutes.**
- **Makes 6 servings.**

With one board to go in the first match of the day, Baseggio had a 4 IMP lead over Hill. Board 10 was a distributional part-score hand, each side holding 20 HCP and a 5-3 fit in their best suit.

Alex Kolesnik opened 1C (strong). Dwyer overcalled 1S, rather than doubling to show the majors. This was passed around to Kolesnik. Since his partner had denied game-going values, Alex chose to defend.

Steve Price led the C3. Dummy played the king and Kolesnik won his ace. Alex shifted to his singleton heart, ducked to East's king. Price returned the H5 and Kolesnik trumped. Alex tried the DK and Dwyer ruffed. Kevin played a spade to dummy's queen. Kolesnik won the ace and exited a spade. Declarer drew the last trump, cashed two high hearts, and led a club to the ten and jack. West had 8 tricks for +110.

Things were more exciting at the other table. Bathurst opened 1D. Stark bid 2D showing his major 2-suiter. Franco Baseggio took a preference to 2H and Bathurst showed extra values by making a takeout double. This passed around to John Hurd, who bid 3D. Baseggio liked his trump stack opposite his partner's vulnerable Michaels call. Franco doubled and Stark led the C2 to South's queen and declarer's ace.

Bathurst led his heart and Stark won the ace. Andy played the C8 to South's ten and declarer's jack. Bathurst won the club and exited with a club. Baseggio led the S2 to his partner's jack. Stark played the HQ to dummy's king while declarer discarded a spade. The DJ was led from dummy and declarer claimed nine tricks for +670. 13 IMPs to Hill who won the match by 9 IMPs.

In IMPs, as opposed to matchpoints, the risk/reward factor comes into play. In matchpoints, defeating a partscore contract and earning 100 while your counterparts earn 110 is a disaster, but in IMPs, it is little difference... and when you slip a trick and let the contract make, it becomes a disaster in every situation... turning a whole match win into a loss!

Board 32 in Bishel/Stokes got more interesting as the hand was played. Both tables reached 3NT. John Bishel played it from West and Emma Kolesnik played it from East. In Bishel's auction, 2C was NON game forcing.

Bjerkan made the most threatening lead of the D3. John put up dummy's jack and Rozanne Pollack properly ducked. John won his singleton ace.

John played a small heart to the ace and a heart to the king hoping for a 2-2 or the queen coming down. When neither of those things happened, he cashed the CK and played the CJ toward dummy. When Bjerkan showed out, the contract was doomed.

At the other table, Kolesnik's 2C was game forcing with 2+ clubs. Once Amber showed hearts and clubs, it would seem that Emma's 3D was "conveniently waiting." When Amber bid 3S, Emma bid 3NT.

Hinton, perhaps believing that 3D showed something in the suit, led the ST. Emma won dummy's king and played the CA and CJ. When Clerkin showed out, Emma ran the club to South's queen and collected 10 tricks.

Ironically these two tables were in the same match. Every other table (see below) played successfully in clubs; seven tables in the small slam and one in the grand slam.

The Baseggio/Zhang match was a different story. At one table, Ethan Liu opened 1H and Ralph Buchalter overcalled 2C. Jun Shi bid 3D showing a mixed raise in hearts. Jeff Roman made a responsive double. Liu passed and Buchalter bid 4C.

Shi led the S5. Liu cashed the SK followed by the SA and played a third spade. Declarer trumped with the C7 and Shi overruffed with the queen. Shi exited with a heart to declarer's ace. Buchalter trumped his losing heart and played the CT. This held the trick, but North was still able to score his CK to defeat the contract one trick.

As luck would have it, this contract is unbeatable. Price led the H9 and Chen ducked, winning the heart continuation. Chen played a diamond to dummy's queen and followed with the CT, ducked to South's queen. Declarer won the heart continuation and led a diamond to dummy's ace. This was followed by the club finesse. When that won, declarer claimed nine tricks for +600.
