

# Kibitzing on VuGraph

There will be deferred kibitzing in the KO as there was in the Round Robin:

Quarter 4: 8:30 pm

To kibitz, go to [the RealBridge kibitzing website](#), enter your name and click on Log In. That will take you to a screen where you can select the event to kibitz.

After you select Kibitz JLaI Online Teams #5, you will be taken to a lobby with a list of tables on the left and a chat box and list of people on the right. The table listing shows the team & player names at each table, as well as the board being played. There will be information about the number of kibitzers and whether there is audio/video commentary (a picture of a TV means there is). Click on a table to kibitz it.

At the table, you will see a hand diagram, and the bidding and play as it happened.

There is a chat window on the right of the screen. You can type chat into the chat window.

Some things you can do to get more information:

If there is an asterisk next to a bid, that means it was Alerted/Explained. Click on the bid to see the explanation.

-- "Rewind" using the slider underneath the "table." Move the handle to the left to go to earlier tricks.

-- Click on the "Scores" button to the left of the South player's name to get a scorecard for the match.

----Click on a board number to see the hand record and results at all of the tables.

----You can also click on a number in a yellow box to get to the hand record from some screens.

----In the hand record screen, click on a result to see the bidding and play at a specific table.

--In the upper left corner:

----Click on the yellow box with 4 little boxes to get the match scores for all the matches (that will be IMPs and for the Round Robin will not include scores from previous rounds).

----Click on the yellow box with 3 bulleted lines to get Cross-IMPs for the pairs (that will be just for this match).

The Scores information is also available in the lobby using the button at the upper right should you want to check on scores before deciding which table to watch.

## TIMING OF DEFERRAL

The Round Robin matches will be deferred until each round is completed.

The first half KO matches will be deferred for half an hour or until each board has been played at all tables, so there may sometimes be a period when nothing new is being shown because one or two tables are very slow to play the board. **For the**


**second half of the KO matches, the delay will be until the quarter is scheduled to be completed, so players will not be able to get useful state of match information. That means that the 3rd quarter kibitzing will start at 6:25 EST.**



The only cold game on Board 1 is 4S by N/S. No pair found the magic Moysian. Two pairs did play game successfully ... Bramley/Woolsey in 3NT and Hu/Xing in 5D **from South**. Bramley/Woolsey succeeded because of misdefense by their opponents when East cashed the HAK and West unblocked the jack!! (see page 7 for story). Hu/Xing succeeded when West led the CQ (his partner's overcalled suit) instead of a heart and declarer was able to discard a heart on the 4th round of spades. From North, East would always lead a high heart.

Berkowitz/Meckstroth and Grue/Moss both went down in game. They both played 5D from North. East cashed two high hearts and eventually West scored a trump trick to defeat the contract.

In the Junior match, Eckert/Pahk stopped in 3D from North and took ten tricks on the heart lead.

In Lall/Levine, Krekorian/Lall played 4D from South, taking eleven tricks on the CQ lead. North passed in first seat and East opened 1C. The club lead was automatic. Declarer played as described above to collect 11 tricks.

Jeff Hu and Henry Xing reached 5D from the South hand on Board 1. Hu opened 1C (2+ clubs) in first seat. Evan Alexis over-called 3C natural. Xing bid 3D and Isaac Stone competed with 4C.

4C was passed around to Xing, who judged that his partner's values would be useful in a diamond contract. Henry jumped to 5D. The opening lead was the CQ and Xing took eleven tricks.

7 IMPs to Hu

The most unusual result occurred in the Bramley/Donner match.

Bramley opened 1NT (10–12) in first seat. Woolsey's 2D response was a game forcing relay and the 2NT rebid showed 4-4 in either the majors or the minors. Woolsey bid 3NT (relay). Bramley passed.

Rimstedt led the HA. Donner followed with the five and declarer contributed the three. Since Rimstedt could see all of the small hearts, the H5 was an encouraging signal (UDCA). Rimstedt cashed the HK. Thinking that his partner held four or five good hearts, Donner unblocked the jack! Rimstedt continued hearts. Bramley won the HT. He played a small diamond, ducked around to the jack. Donner returned the CQ, and Bramley claimed ten tricks.

Maybe Rimstedt should work out the heart position and discontinue the suit at trick three. If Donner held JTxx of hearts, he might not risk throwing away a trick by unblocking the jack. The unblock is only necessary if partner started with AKxxx. In this JTxx-AKxxx hypothetical case, declarer's distribution is exactly 3-2-4-4 which leaves East with a two or three suited hand with a good heart suit. A pass over 1NT (10-21) might not be that likely.

Similarly, maybe Donner shouldn't unblock the jack. Unless East holds AKT8, the unblock blows a trick. This was a tough defensive position and E/W needed to work it out. Also, since South didn't search for a major suit fit, it is likely that declarer has both majors and "fourth from longest and strongest" might be the called for lead. This would hold declarer to six tricks.

The Donner team was down one in 5D at the other table. 10 IMPs to Bramley

Howie Dung will return to the retiree's home and receive more therapy. Some play with snakes, some try to rhyme. Limey Jack will return for the USBF Trials.



# Some Suggestions For Dining at Home Between Sessions! Pandemic Pleasures...

## Dutch Cheese Soup

### Ingredients

- ¼ C (59 ml) vegetable oil
- ½ C (76 g) onions, diced
- 1 C (230 g) cauliflower, diced
- 2 med potatoes, cut into 1/2-inch (1.3-cm) cubes
- 2 med carrots, cut into 1/2-inch (1.3-cm) cubes
- 4 C (946 ml) low sodium chicken broth
- 2 Tbsp (29 g) butter
- 4 oz (113 g) Canadian bacon, diced
- 5 oz (142 g) Gouda cheese, thinly sliced
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 8 ½-in (13-mm) slices sourdough baguette

### Directions

Place oil in a 1½-quart (1420-ml) saucepan over medium-high heat. Add onion; sauté until soft; add cauliflower, carrots and potatoes; sauté 5 minutes. Stir in chicken broth and simmer. Meanwhile, heat butter in a small skillet; add canadian bacon; sauté until lightly browned; add to soup. Reduce heat to low and cover, simmering until vegetables are tender, about 15 minutes. Pour soup into 4 individual ovenproof bowls, topping each with 2 bread slices and one quarter of cheese. Place under broiler until cheese is bubbly and serve immediately.

- **Prep time: 12 minutes.**
- **Cook time: 30 minutes.**
- **Makes 4 servings.**



# Viennese Roast Beef with Onions

## Ingredients

- 4 Tbsp (57 g) unsalted butter
- 2 med onions, peeled & thinly sliced
- 1 tsp (2.4 g) sweet Hungarian paprika
- 6 8-oz (227-g) boneless beef sirloin steaks, pounded ¼-in (6.4-mm) thick
- Salt and freshly ground pepper to taste
- 3 Tbsp (44 ml) vegetable oil
- 4 C (946 ml) low sodium beef stock or broth, fresh or canned, boiled down to 2 C (473 g)
- ½ C (60 g) sour cream


## Directions

Preheat oven to 350°F (177°C). In a large cast-iron skillet, melt butter over medium heat. Sauté onions until light brown, stirring often; add paprika; cook another minute. Remove onions from pan; set aside. Season steaks with salt and pepper. Add vegetable oil to same skillet and add steaks; brown on both sides. Turn off heat, add beef stock to skillet, arrange onions on top and cover. Bake until tender, about 2 hours–2 hours 30 minutes. To serve, place steaks on a pre-warmed serving platter with onions arranged on top. Cover loosely to keep warm. Return skillet with remaining liquid to high heat and bring to a boil. Stir in sour cream; immediately remove from heat and pour over steaks. Serve immediately.

This dish is traditionally served with roast potatoes or buttered parsley potatoes; you can garnish with crispy fried onions if you like.

- **Prep time: 5 minutes.**
- **Cook time: 2 hours–2 hours 30 minutes.**
- **Makes 6 large servings.**

# Beef Pho

## Ingredients

### BROTH

- 3 lb (1361 g) beef knuckle or hind shank
- 1 tsp (5 g) salt
- 1 onion, cut in half
- 2 pieces star anise
- ½ cinnamon stick
- 1 clove
- ½ tsp (1.5 g) peppercorns
- 1 slice fresh ginger root
- ½ Tbsp (10 g) sugar, preferably yellow rock sugar
- ½ Tbsp (15 ml) fish sauce

### SOUP

- 1 lb (454 g) fresh or dried banh pho rice noodles
- 1½ lb (680 g) sirloin, partially frozen

### ACCOMPANIMENTS

- 1 sm red onion, thinly sliced
- ½ C (20 g) cilantro, coarsely chopped
- 2 C (160 g) bean sprouts
- 1 C (40 g) sweet basil, coarsely chopped
- 1 bunch green onion, thinly sliced
- ¼ C (60 g) Sriracha
- 3 limes, quartered

## Directions

### BROTH

Place beef knuckle in a large stockpot. Add salt and a gallon of water. Bring to a boil; reduce heat; simmer 2 hours, skimming regularly. Add broth seasonings and simmer about 4 hours. Strain broth; discard bones, spices and onion.

### SOUP


The last 20 minutes of broth cooking, soak rice noodles in water. Once broth is finished, drain noodles.

Place strained broth in stockpot and keep at a low boil. Slice frozen sirloin very thin—enough to cook instantly; set aside. Cook noodles in boiling salted water about 5 minutes, just until soft; distribute drained noodles among serving bowls; top with beef slices and ladle boiling broth over beef.

### ACCOMPANIMENTS

Serve with accompaniments to be added to taste.

- **Cook time: 6 hours 25 minutes.**
- **Makes 8 servings.**





At the other table, Feldman opened 1C (2+) and Martel responded 1D (showing hearts).

Joe Grue bid 1H (intended as t/o for the black suits.)

Feldman passed (denying three card heart support) and Moss, who apparently assumed 1H was natural, raised to 2H.

Martel doubled and Grue ran to 3C. Feldman doubled. Moss made an SOS redouble. The wheels had come off the bus! Their best: Moss/Grue could have run to 3D, which could be defeated 5 tricks. Grue sat for 3CXX.

Perfect defense can hold declarer to one trick as follows: East leads the HK and continues with a heart to West's jack. West cashes the HA and leads the CQ. North ducks and West can continue clubs to East's nine. East cashes the CA and exits with a club. North wins the CK and plays a spade. East wins the SA and draws the last two trumps before playing the DJ through dummy's queen. The defense would score the rest of the tricks for +4800.

Alas, the defense wasn't perfect, but still... Feldman led the HK and continued with a heart to Martel's jack. Chip cashed the HA and shifted to S9. Grue played the SK and Feldman won the SA. Feldman played the DJ. When this held, he exited with a spade to dummy's ten. Grue trumped a diamond and played the SQ. Feldman ruffed the spade and played the CJ, which held the trick. Feldman cashed the CA and exited with a club to declarer's king. The defense took one more trick holding declarer to four tricks and scoring +2800.



Board 43 is a good example of how the most sophisticated of conventions does not always work as expected. For years, multi-2D showing a variety of hands including the most common: a weak two in one of the other major, was barred. It was barred because defending against it was so complex.

In Donner/Bramley yesterday, Woolsey opened 2D holding a weak two in spades. Molson, holding six good hearts and a side suit of AKQ2 in diamonds overcalled 2H hoping Sandra Rimstedt would have enough to raise to game. Sandra held three jacks and a king spread in all four suits, and rightly passed 2H.

Janice lost the expected four tricks: 1 heart, 1 spade, 1 club and 1 club ruff. +140

At the other table, Moss, playing strong club and employing light openers, opened 1S. Martel doubled and Grue jumped to 4S, described as Precision-style, wide ranging to play. This ended the auction.

Bramley held a 13 IMP lead over Donner at the halfway point of their semifinal match. On the Board 31, Donner took the lead and held on for the rest of the match to win by a narrow margin of 8 IMPs.

Moss/Grue had a strong club/relay auction to reach the making 6NT contract.

1C was strong and artificial.

1H was artificial and showed 12+ HCP.

1S asked and 1NT showed 5+ spades and not 5-3-3-2

2C asked and 2D showed 4+ clubs

2H asked and 2S showed 6+ spades and exactly 4 clubs

2NT asked and 4D showed 7 spades and a diamond void

4NT asked controls and 6S showed 6 control points (A=2, K=1)

Moss knew that Grue held three aces and did not hold the SK. With 18HCP opposite 12+HCP and double stoppers in clubs, diamonds and hearts, Moss judged that 6NT would

only depend on East holding a second honor (queen or jack) in spades or clubs and a black suit break.

Feldman led the D6. Grue won the ace and finessed the SQ losing to South's king. Since the spades broke 3-2, 12 tricks were there for the taking.

At the other table, Woolsey /Bramley had a similar strong club/relay auction. Woolsey was able to check on queens and when Bramley denied the CQ, Woolsey chose 6H. 6H was defeated by the 6-0 trump split. 14 IMPs to Donner
