## VACCINATION REQUIRED:

All players in the 2022 Open USBC MUST be vaccinated against CoVid19.
Players must submit proof of vaccination to the USBF Secretary (Jan Martel) before play commences in the event.

There are no exceptions to this rule.

## Hospitality Suite...

Because of Covid, we won't be able to provide the full hospitality we have in the past, but we will do what we can.

Hosts Maya Alela and Marie-France Benoit will be in our hospitality suite (Room 2321). They will provide grab and go breakfast and lunch each day, except that on Monday and Tuesday, lunch will be a buffet in the hotel restaurant.

Breakfast: From 8-10 am. There will be individually packaged cereal, fruit, hard boiled eggs, bagels, and some hot options. Also individual butter, jam, peanut butter, and cream cheese, as well as condiment packages. Maya \& Marie-France will be making coffee and will have individual packages of sugar, sweetener, and dairy \& non-dairy creamers. For those of you who prefer Keurig coffee, that will also be available in the hospitality suite. We are limiting access to 6 players at any one time, so we ask that you come to the suite, pick up a large to go container and put the smaller packages in that to take with you as quickly as you can, and then go someplace else to eat. Masks that cover your nose \& mouth must be worn in the Hospitality Suite at all times. There will be a hand sanitizer station near the door and we encourage you to sanitize your hands before choosing what to take.

Lunch: Monday, from 2:30-5:00 and Tuesday from 2:00-4:30 there will be a buffet lunch in the hotel restaurant. You will need to show a convention card or SSF to prove you're with the bridge tournament. Please tell the hotel staff if you see someone who isn't one of us, since we are paying for each lunch.
From Wednesday on, lunch will be available in the hospitality suite from 2-4 pm (the first half of play each day ends at 2:35; we encourage those of you who are sitting out the 2 nd quarter to go early). There will be a main dish (sandwiches, chicken, main dish salads, pizza) as well as tuna salad, green salad, cheese, fruit, and berries... Also all the individual packages of add-ons we have for breakfast. Water and soft drinks will be available in refrigerators.

Let us know what you want: If there is a menu for a future day's lunch hanging on the wall outside the Hospitality Suite, please mark what you want, so we have a better idea of what to order.

## Playing Rooms \& Player's Break Room

We will have bottled water in the playing rooms and if there is a refrigerator in a playing room we'll stock it with soft drinks.

We wil also have bottled water in the Player's Break Room (1321), as well as soft drinks, nespresso, some packaged snacks, and some fruit.

AGAIN: Masks that cover your nose \& mouth must be worn in the Player's Break Room at all times, so you may not eat and drink in the room.

If you want to listen to commentary, search for the TV icon to choose from the available live commentary. If it doesn't respond, no one is commenting.

## Nail biting!

You can choose the "Match view" at the starting page of your event and your screen will split into four small screens - two showing the two tables of the match you choose, the other two having the scoresheet for your match and the current scores of the other matches. In the $2 \times 2$ view you can also personalize the content in your windows. (The $2 \times 2$ view is not available on mobile devices.)

## Think together!

When watching a table, click on a name and choose "Kibitz". Instead of seeing all 4 hands, you will see what the player sees, and you can decide what you would do and see whether your player agrees.

## More Information:

The image of the sticker with the number of the board (upper right) takes you to the results of the board, in the bottom right corner the arrow takes you to the scoresheet, the DDS shows the double dummy analyses, beside that there is a button for the other table of the same match, at the top left corner you can see the bidding with alerts and the explanations (mouse over), the tricks already played, and the double dummy analysis for the available number of tricks with the par score.

## Navigation icons:

While surfing here and there in the vugraph, or amongst the archive sessions, there are icons to help you. You can always go back to the main page with the "house" or to the standings with the "scores". If you cannot see the icons, move your mouse, or touch your screen and they pop up immediately. There is also a built-in back button because the back button of your browser will always take you to the starting page. If this is not what you wanted, push next in your browser and you can continue.

## Replay:

After the event you can find every board from every table easily. While replaying the hands, the only surprise can be the way "next board" button works. If you have arrived from a scoresheet, it navigates through the scoresheet. If you have arrived from a screen where the results were shown for a given board then the same buttons move you through the list. Push every button and enjoy!

Greco led the spade. Finn won the ace and cashed the king and queen of clubs, guessing that suit correctly. He picked up the CJ and when diamonds were 2-2, he claimed 10 tricks. +630 ... 12 IMPs to Kolesnik!

At the other table in Nickell/Kolesnik, Rosenberg opened "light" in third seat. Levin overcalled "strong" (18) with 1NT. Stamatov, not in on the joke, doubled. Rosenberg showed hearts with his spades and Jerry took a preference.

Levin took the first three tricks with the DAK and CK. He continued clubs to Weinstein's ace, ruffed with the S2.

Rosenberg knocked out the SA, Levin continuing the spade suit. Rosenberg won and played the HJ out of hand. Levin played low and Rosenberg rose with dummy's king and finessed Weinstein for the HQ. Levin won the queen and Rosenberg claimed eight tricks for +110 .


In the other room, there was more excitement. When Moss bid 3S, Simson balanced with a double and Aker/Simson defended it there.
$\mathrm{N} / \mathrm{S}$ started with two rounds of trump. Moss won in hand and played the H 6 to the ace in dummy. He continued with the HJ to the $\mathrm{Q}, \mathrm{K}, 2$.

At this point, Brad was home with eleven tricks for +730 !
At the other table, Lo, East, declared 3H undoubled successfully to lose 11 IMPs.

The action continued on Board 3.
Three pairs bid 3NT. Two pairs played 5C. Two pairs stopped in a partscore.

One pair bid slam!!


Fleisher/Simson was interesting. Both tables arrived in 3NT, one from North and one from South.
Played from North, Lo led a diamond instead of a heart, probably because he knew South was 3-4-24 with four hearts. Bramley won the DK and played a small spade from his hand. Lo won the queen and continued with the DT. Bramley won the ace and played three rounds of clubs, Gu pitching one heart and one spade.

Bramley read the position well. Based on the diamond/club plays, it appeared that West held 9 major suit cards. Bart read RHO as starting with five spades for his spade pitch. Bart ran the S9 for a ninth trick ... He took three spades, four clubs and two diamonds to bring home the game!

At the other table, against 3NT by South, Grue led a fourth best heart. E/W cashed four hearts, declarer discarding two spades and a diamond. Grue exited with a spade and when the DQ did not fall singleton, the hand was over.

3NT failed by one trick.

Again, Kolesnik and DelMonte live by the sword, die by the sword!


Rosenberg played two rounds of hearts, the second ruffed by Levin with the S5. Levin played a club which Rosenberg ruffed. Rosenberg played a heart which Levin ruffed. Levin pulled a round of spades and claimed 8 tricks. Contract making with an overtrick for +110 . Expecting a push? NOT!



Again, live by the sword, die by the sword... After great success bidding a close, aggressive slam two days ago... and succeeding off two aces, Finn and Ish bid another close slam... however, this one was not so successful!

Hampson led the C6. Ish won the ace in dummy. Ish played the DJ to the $\mathrm{Q}, \mathrm{K}, 2$. He cashed the DA and ruffed a diamond in dummy. A spade to the ace dropped the queen and another diamond was ruffed with the CK. The C4 revealed the bad split. Ish extracted the rest of the trump. Ish played the SK and claimed 10 tricks, contract failing by 2 !

Considering Risk/Reward, Kolesnik/DelMonte were right overall ... they won more for their earlier slam than they lost on this one so they're money ahead!!!

Kranyak led the D4, Juster winning his king. Juster played the DQ, felling the trumps.

At this point, Juster's best chance to take a trick outside of the diamond suit was to lead toward the SK and hope the ace was onside. The S3 went to the 2, K, A.

Demuy cashed the club king and queen and the spade jack. He tried the CA which Juster ruffed.

Juster ruffed a spade in dummy, played a diamond to his hand and followed with the heart deuce. When Kranyak contributed the nine, Juster ducked!! The defense cashed two more hearts and played a club which was ruffed in both hands! Too much symmetry in the E/W distribution...

Contract finishing down four for -800 .

9 IMPs to Spector



Hampson led the ST and Ish won the ace in dummy. He played the HQ to Hampson's ace. Hampson continued spades and DelMonte ruffed. DelMonte pulled trump ... which nicely split 3-3... He cashed the DA and the SJ, the DK and claimed 12 tricks. 6C would have been a better contract with 8 clubs and only 7 hearts, but this contract scored more and every IMP matters in high-level knockouts!

12 IMPs to Kolesnik


Silverstein won the ace and played the HT to the queen. He cashed the HA and trumps were drawn. A small club from dummy was led to the jack and king. Moss played the S3, won by Lee's eight. Lee played a club which Silverstein won with the queen. He cashed the CA. The D7 went to Lee's ace and the contract was down one!
