Welcome to the 2019 United States Bridge Championships. Here, in Schaumburg, Illinois, we will select team USA2 to represent the United States in the 2019 Bermuda Bowl in Wuhan, China. Eighteen teams are entered in our event.

The Nickell team (Nickell, Katz, Levin, Weinstein, Rodwell and Meckstroth) earned the right to be USA1 in last year's competition in Houston.

For this year, the Rosenthal team (Rosenthal, Silverstein, Willenken, Ginossaur, Berkowitz, Campanile) has earned a bye to the Round of 8 and the Fleisher team (Fleisher, Martel, Greco, Hampson, Grue, Moss) has earned a bye to the Round of 16. The other 16 teams will start in the round robin, with 13 qualifying.

While the USBF Board and the tournament organizers do their best to make this event the fairest Competition year after year, only YOU, the players, can continue to uphold the ethics, camaraderie and sportsmanship for which United States bridge is known worldwide. Many foreign players have told me that they view our Competition as the best in the world, in large part because of our long matches and high ethical standards.

I know I will attempt to do my part to uphold these standards and I ask that each of you keep this in mind throughout the events (Open, Women's, Mixed, and Seniors).

Let the games begin!

TABLE ASSIGNMENTS

Each team will have a "home" table for the entire Round Robin. You will be NS at your home table. Your NS pair must remain at your home table for all of matches 13-15 and cannot wander. Your EW pair will play at your opponent's home table each round.

SCORE SUBMISSION

After each match, you must turn in a form showing your score (in IMPs) for the match; please enter the IMPs for each team, not the net IMPs. If you have time to confirm the score with your opponent before submitting it, please do so, but if you do not have time, turn the score in anyway. The score submission form also has a box to use to enter your lineup. If you do not put anything in that box, you have submitted the identical lineup you had for the previous match - the same players are playing in the same seats.

SEQUESTERED MATCHES

The final 3 matches on Saturday will be sequestered. One pair on your team must play all 3 matches NS at your home table. No score comparison is allowed during the 3-match clump. You may change your EW pair during those matches.

For the first two sequestered matches, the NS pair at each table will be asked to complete a score sheet & have the EW pair verify that it is correct. We will pick up those score sheets and enter the scores into the computer in order to have your scores for those matches completed by the time you finish the third match. Those scores will be posted on a wall in the Players' Break Room. You will be asked to confirm that those scores are correct when you turn in your score for the final match. We hope that this procedure will speed up the determination of which teams have qualified.

Vugraph

The 2019 Open USBC will be covered on BBO Vugraph starting with the Round of 16 on Sunday, May 12th. Some, but not all, of the tables will be featured.

From the Quarterfinals on, all of the tables in play will be covered.

To watch the Vugraph online, go to the **<u>BBO website</u>** where you can either log on directly from your browser, go to "Vugraph" and choose which table to watch, or use the download version of the BBO software to run BBO on your computer (only available if you already have it, not to new users). If you choose the latter approach, from the Lobby, click on the button labeled VUGRAPH and you'll be able to choose which of the matches you want to watch.

To watch on your smartphone or tablet, install the BBO app and watch using that.

There will often be a "yellow" user on BBO called USBF. If you have general questions, ask USBF, not one of the hard-working Vugraph operators, who may not have time to respond to private messages.

Each day's schedule is the same (these are Chicago times; to see the times for your time-zone, go to the **<u>BBO Vugraph schedule site</u>**)

Hints for BBO viewers

Useful information is available to browser BBO users [and perhaps mobile BBO users] if you click on the name of the table/event you will get a pop-up that:

* displays the BBO Schedule for the specific vugraph event – calculated for the time zone of the viewer's electronic device

* has a link to the home page for the event

if you click on a player name you will usually get a pop-up that

* displays a picture of the player

* shows links to System Summary Forms (SSFs), Convention Cards (CCs), and biographical information

VIDEO: Live video streaming is not available for this event.

Video from the event tables will be uploaded to YouTube as soon as can be managed.

All About Kibitzing

WHEN CAN YOU KIBITZ IN THE PLAYING ROOMS?

You will be able to kibitz at any of the tables during this event, except in the Closed Room during the final sequestered matches of the Round Robin, **subject to the following regulations:**

Kibitzers may enter the room ONLY at the start of play for a segment. Once play has started, the room will be closed.

A kibitzer who leaves the room may not return until the start of the next segment.

Cell phones and other electronic devices are not allowed in the playing rooms, even if they are turned off. Any kibitzer who is found with a cell phone will be evicted and not allowed to kibitz during the remainder of the tournament.

When a match is being shown on BBO Vugraph, no kibitzer may sit on the same side of the table as the Vugraph operator.

SCREENS

All of the USBC is played with screens. If you've never kibitzed at a table with screens before, you need to know that it is quite different from kibitzing at a regular table. You need to be seated at an "open" corner of the table (not next to the screen) in order to see, and once there are 4 kibitzers at a table it will be very hard for additional kibitzers to see.

USBC KIBITZING RULES

The USBF <u>General Conditions of Contest</u> contain specific rules about kibitzers. They are designed to promote security at the tournament and are set forth in the conditions of contest section labeled "Security." They are:

GENERAL RULES

a. During any use of duplicated boards across multiple matches, Kibitzers must select one table for kibitzing and may not move to any other table during a session or segment.

b. Kibitzers may not speak with players, must watch only one hand at a time, may not sit in such a position as to see more than one hand at a time, may not sit in such a position as to see a computer screen in use for Internet broadcast, must check communication devices with the Director, cannot call attention to irregularities other than a board being placed incorrectly on the table (arrow positioning), but may serve as witnesses to a possible irregularity.

c. Kibitzers must enter the playing room before play commences. Kibitzers are required to remain until the segment of play is completed at the table they are watching or to leave the playing area entirely. Kibitzers are expected to abide by the same rules as the players regarding leaving the room (e.g. be escorted to the restroom).

d. Except as expressly provided in these conditions and appendices, NPC's shall be subject to the WBF General Conditions, Section 17.

e. No one other than the Internet broadcast personnel and Tournament Directors may watch any computer screen or any other mechanism for enabling the Internet broadcast at any time in either the Closed or the Open Room.

f. These rules may be revised in specific instances by the DICs for the orderly running of the event.

The defense was done!

Gold led his HQ and Delimpalita had to part with his SA or a club from the JT!

Obviously Delimpalita could have won his spade ace and none of this would have ensued. It was the case of the disappearing ace!

Gold executed the squeeze... albeit for an overtrick in IMPs, but still great to watch. 1 IMP to Zia/Gold

Well done!

David Gold opened a 15-17 NT and Zia bid 3H showing heart shortness. Gold had no problem with that since he held the AKQ8. He bid 3NT and played it there.

Delimpalta led the DJ. Gold covered with the queen and Vroustis won his ace.

Vroustis shifted to the H9 and Gold won the king. Gold led the D8. Delimpalta covered with the nine and Gold ducked in dummy. Delimpalta continued the attack on diamonds, Gold winning with Zia's king.

The C7 was led to the king and the S4 was ducked to the SK. The D3 and D4 were cashed, declarer shedding two spades and Delimpalta shedding his major suit tens.

A club was played to the ace and HA was cashed, Delimpalta discarding the SJ and dummy the S3.

The position:





Eldad Ginossaur of the Rosenthal team is not only an accomplished player, but also a recent bridge author. His book, *Power Up Your Game*, has been well-received among the Chicago bridge contingent, both experienced and inexperienced. The book's "Conclusion" is excerpted below. It alone made me want to read the text!

Conclusion

I am writing this conclusion while on vacation in Tel Aviv, Israel. Yesterday I played a 3person ball game with my two nieces, 5 and 8 years old. The game's main principle was 2 against 1. Naturally, my nieces teamed up against me and instantly lost. However, after a

game or two, they started strategizing. Before each new game, they had a brief (and discreet) conversation. They would go over codes that they invented, thereby improving their partnership strategy against me. And what do you know? They started winning.

Much like this ball game with my nieces, **bridge is a partnership game**. You win together, lose together, and improve together. Try to spend time with your partner talking about bridge. For instance, discuss the concepts in this book. Many of the lessons contain conventions and tactics which require partnership agreements. To be effective, both players must be on the same wavelength. Discuss bridge concepts with your partner whenever possible!

Always remember that playing too many conventions can damage your partnership results. The mutual decision to play a new convention should not be taken lightly. As a solidly tested bidding or defense convention improves your game, it is just as true that a partnership that plays too many conventions or plays conventions that are quite complicated may lose more than it gains. If you feel that you are not ready for a new convention, let your partner know. Do not force yourself or your partner to start any new convention unless you both feel ready. Communicate with your partner!

In all levels of the game, the key to success is a strong partnership. Two people working together, cooperating with a similar purpose of winning, playing good bridge or just having fun makes this game we love so wonderful.

Meet the Players

Meet the Players is a regular feature in the USBC Daily Bulletins. Each day we will focus on one of two of the players in the Championship.

The USBF Does More Than Run The USBC



The USBF has an ongoing Junior Training program, run by Michael Rosenberg, with prominent mentors working with young players who aspire to reach great heights, including representing the USA in Junior competition. The mentors and mentees meet regularly on either Sunday nights or Monday nights, playing against one another and discussing the hands on BBO.

Many of the youth have become excellent players after only a few years in the program. Most continue to play after aging out of their groups and some have become really good.

Often a hand shows up that would be of interest not only to the teacher and student but also to others.

Such was the case on Sunday, April 28, in Stan Subeck's group with Raphael Hallerman and Cynthia Huang sitting East/ West, and Ellie Fashingbauer sitting North partnering Stan who filled in for a late attendee. Stan made a deceptive play to see how well his students concentrated on the action.

The play and the players:

Raphael and Cynthia reached 6S after a thoughtful auction.

FYI: Both are members of the University of Chicago Collegiate team competing in Las Vegas this summer as part of the ACBL Collegiate Championships. They are also representing ACBL District 13 in the upcoming Flight C Grand National Teams competition, also in Vegas this summer.

The auction:

1NT was 15-17; 2C was Stayman; 3H established spades as trump and started a slam try sequence. After 3NT by East, 4D and 4H were cuebids. 4NT was Roman Keycard Blackwood and 5H showed two keycards without the trump queen. West bid 6S.

The play:

South led the S3 and North followed with the four. How should declarer play?

The most obvious choice appears to be playing to take six spade tricks by trumping two diamonds in hand. The plan would be to trump the third diamond low, cross to dummy in trumps and ruff the fourth diamond with the king. The jack of clubs will provide the dummy entry needed to finish drawing trumps.

Declarer can play two high diamonds on which North plays the three and four. **South follows with the eight and the ten!** If South started with a doubleton diamond, declarer cannot afford to trump low on the third round of diamonds. Declarer plays a third diamond and North follows with the six. Someone has concealed the seemingly meaningless D2. If North started with the 6432 of diamonds, South has QT8 and declarer can trump with the spade king. The DJ will be the twelfth trick. If declarer trumps high and the DQ doesn't fall, declarer can finish drawing trumps and rely on a heart guess for the twelfth trick.

The full hand follows:

At the table, Cynthia passed Stan's test with flying colors. It didn't help her make her contract, but it was gratifying to note that she paid attention to the fall of the spot cards and dutifully ruffed the D5 HIGH! From the standpoint of the result, the operation was a failure, but it was gratifying to note that the students are watching the spots and considering the best lines of play.

At the level of the USBC, you could see plays like this often. The lesson for the students was "things are not always as they seem." Consider whether or not to credit your opponent with careful tactics and play accordingly. Either play could have been right on the hand, remember that just like you, as declarer falsecard to mess with the minds of your opponents, your opponents will do the same to you!
