The Prez Says ...

Welcome to Schaumburg, Illinois, home of the 2025 United States Bridge Championships. We will be selecting USA1 and USA2 for the 2025 World Bridge Teams, August 20-31, in Herning, Denmark.

The United States is entitled to two teams in each division. Each stage of the USA1 events will be 2 days long.

Open First: The bracket for the Open is on page 16 of this bulletin. There are 16 teams entered. Competition commences April 24th.

As in last year’s competition, the event will be played using LoveBridge software on ChromeBooks. *For more information, see Section XIV of the USBF General Conditions of Contest for 2025.*

Play Requirements: Each player must play 50% of the boards in each KO match in order to continue on the team. *See General CoC Section XII for how to count boards and potential waiver of this requirement.*

Closed Notes: Players may not consult their notes at any time during play, unless they are dummy.

Withdrawal: A player or team may withdraw at any time.

Proof of Vaccination is NOT required for play. Masks are optional, however, if a masked roommate asks you to mask-up, you are required to do so. Please bring a mask so as to be prepared.

If a player tests positive for Covid-19 or has any other respiratory illness during the F2F stages of play, and wants to continue to play, the DIC may allow the player to continue to compete in a separate hotel room. In that situation, both the ill player and their screenmate will be video recorded during play.

The USBF Board of Directors and the Tournament Committee do their best to ensure the fairest Competition year after year. WE, the players, do our part by upholding the high level of ethics, camaraderie and sportsmanship for which the USBF is known worldwide. Good luck all! Let the games begin!



More information about LoveBridge kibitzing... Set up your screen as you like it best.

You will see a **single table** if you click on the blue arrow on the scores page with buttons for more info.

Match View will show you two tables of a match side by side on your screen;

Split View will give you 4 panes and you can put whatever you want in each of them.

Click on Buttons to get interesting information:

●The image of the sticker with the number of the board (upper right) takes you to the results of the board;

●the arrow in the bottom right corner takes you to the scoresheet

●the DDS shows the double dummy analyses, beside that there is a button for the other table of the same match,

●at the top left corner you can see the bidding with alerts and the explanations (mouse over), the tricks already played, and the double dummy analysis for the available number of tricks with the par score.

NEW THIS YEAR: Written commentary will show in a large area on the left of the screen in Single Table view and at the top of the screen in Match View. If you are interesting in providing written commentary, please [email Jan](#) and she will get you authorized.

Navigation icons:

While surfing on the vugraph, or amongst the archives, you can go back to the main page with the "house" or to the standings with the "scores". If you cannot see the icons, move your mouse, or touch your screen and they pop up. There is also a built-in back button because the back button of your browser will always take you to the starting page. If this is not what you wanted, push next in your browser and you can continue where you were.

How to find System Information: If you want to look at a pair's System Summary Form or ACBL Convention card, just go to the Teams Entered page and click on either player's name.

There should be enough room for you to eat in the restaurant, but you are also welcome to take food from there to an outside table or to your hotel room. Lunch will be served from 1:45-3:45. After the first 4 days of each event and for all of the Seniors, lunch will be available in the hospitality suite from 1:45-3:45. There will be a main dish (sandwiches, chicken, main dish salads, pizza) as well as tuna salad, green salad, cheese, fruit, berries, cookies or other desserts.

There is a water dispenser in the room, and we have refillable water bottles for you in room 1321 (we'll put a label with your name on yours). Soft drinks will be available in refrigerators. As with breakfast, you are welcome to eat in the hospitality suite unless it is too crowded.

Let us know what you want: If you have specific needs, please let our hosts know and they will do their very best to provide food that meets your needs.

Playing Rooms & Player's Break Room

We have a water dispenser in the Player's Break Room (1321), as well as soft drinks, Nespresso, some packaged snacks, and some fruit. We ask that you recognize that we are working in that room, and others are still playing in the rooms next door and across the hall, so please try to keep voices low. Jan Kamras In Memoriam 1950 – 2025

The World Bridge Federation (WBF) is deeply saddened to announce the passing of its esteemed President, Jan Kamras.

Jan passed away peacefully, after a period of illness.

Jan served as President of the WBF with unwavering dedication and passion. Despite facing health challenges throughout his presidency, he demonstrated extraordinary strength and commitment and continued to work tirelessly, driven by his profound love for the game.

One of the goals of Jan's presidency was to introduce the WBF World Tour, a ranking system based on cumulative performances at Bridge Championships, as well as select Festivals and Tournaments. The Trophy for the winners is named after Jan.

Jan was originally from Gothenburg, Sweden, but about a decade ago had moved to Tel Aviv, Israel. He was the Vice-President of the Swedish Bridge Federation from 2005 to 2016 and served, among other positions, as head of its National Team Selection Committee. He was the Captain of the Swedish National Open team 2001-2010. As a player he won the Swedish Team Championships in 2010 and was runner-up in 2011 and 2012. He won the prestigious Cavendish Teams in 2013.

Jan was elected to the European Bridge League Executive Committee in 2010. He was elected EBL Honorary Secretary and a member of the Presidential Council. He was the chairman of the Championships, IT, NBO Liaison and Master Points Committees and a member of the Finance, Material Procurement, Reviewer, Rules & Regulations, Special Investigations and Statutes Committees. He was elected EBL President in 2018.

In 2018 he was elected a member of the WBF Executive Council. In 2022 at the meeting held on 25th August in Wroclaw, Poland the WBF Executive Council unanimously elected him as President and he took up office on 1 January 2023.

The World Bridge Federation expresses its deepest condolences to Jan's family and friends during this difficult time.



It is with profound sadness that the World Bridge Federation learned of the passing of **Bogdan Marina**. Bogdan's presence at WBF Championships was marked by his infectious good humor and friendliness. He achieved remarkable results, particularly with the Romanian Mixed Team, winning two World bronze medals.

Beyond his skill at the bridge table, Bogdan was known for his warm personality and genuine camaraderie.

The WBF extends its deepest condolences to his wife and teammate, Marina, during this incredibly difficult time.



ABOUT SCHAUMBURG:

Located just 30 miles outside Chicago and about 11 miles west of O'Hare International Airport, Schaumburg is arguably a premier suburban business destination in Illinois. In the past 60 years, Schaumburg has transformed from a small farming community into a thriving economic center that is home to more business in Illinois than any other community outside of Chicago. The village's businesses provide support to the community's 78,000 residents, 80,000 employees and the northwest suburbs.

Residents and visitors can attend a concert or the Farmers Market in the Town Square, take in theater and other shows at the Al Larson Prairie Center for the Arts, visit the Trickster Cultural Center (Native-owned and operated art gallery), discover family fun at Legoland Discovery Center, or enjoy independent league baseball at Wintrust Field. And, the Schaumburg Township District Library is the second-largest public library in Illinois, with more than one million visitors each year.

History

The Village of Schaumburg was incorporated on March 7, 1956, but the heritage of Schaumburg dates back to the much earlier times when the first inhabitants of the area were members of the Sauk, Fox, Pottawatomie, and Kickapoo Indian tribes. Schaumburg's earliest residents were primarily German-speaking immigrants and their days consisted of farming, community and family. In many ways that remains true today, although now Schaumburg is a mecca of commercial activity.

The First Settlers

By the mid-nineteenth century, settlers first began to arrive from Germany and the eastern United States. Legend has it that the earliest settler was Trumbull Kent from Oswego, New York. Kent, a "Yankee," as settlers from New England were called in the west, founded a settlement in 1835 not far from what is now called Olde Schaumburg Centre, formerly known as Sarah's Grove.

The Sunderlage Family

The first recorded settler of Schaumburg Township was German-born Johann Sunderlage. According to legend, Sunderlage was a member of a survey team that divided Cook County into townships around 1833. He liked the area so much that, upon completion of the project, he brought his family from Germany and settled in the area around 1836.

Sunderlage and his family occupied their land in the Township until the federal land sale of 1842 allowed them to purchase the property and obtain the deed. Sunderlage and Kent represented the predominant groups that settled Schaumburg Township in its early days. In 1840, 56 percent of the Township households originated from the eastern United States, while 28 percent were German-born. By the 1850s, the population mix had settled to 28 percent "Yankee" and 48 percent German.

German Settlers

By 1870, Schaumburg Township had become completely German. Land records show that all the property in the Township was owned by German immigrants or their descendants. This pattern emerged as many Yankee settlers continued to travel west for the promise of newly opened lands on the Great Plains. The land they occupied in Schaumburg was then purchased by German-born immigrants.

Schaumburg Township remained almost exclusively under German ownership until the Great Depression of the 1930s. The Depression caused the foreclosure on some German-owned farms which were then purchased by non-German individuals and companies. Nonetheless, German heritage remained important in the area. German was the first language of the majority of households until the 1950s. St. Peter Lutheran Church, the community's oldest church which was constructed in 1847, held services in German as late as 1970.



Everything You Need to Know About LoveBridge and May Have Forgotten!

Just a Disclaimer... Some of the below may be obsolete with the new Chromebooks!*

*Jan says, "The only real changes from the pads to the Chromebooks involve the keyboard being part of the Chromebook and the larger screen. The biggest differences from previous years is each pair has its own time clock and will be shown their time remaining at the beginning of each hand, and a "STOP" button that a player can click on to stop play at both sides of the table when they are calling the director about something and it would be bad to have the other side of the table act before the director rules.

The directors have tested the Chromebooks and advise that some of the screen display may be new to you!

- **What does that number in the upper left mean?** You have unread chat message(s) and the strip at the left will be a sky blue until you read them (the number indicates how many unread messages are there). Click on the number/strip on the left to open/view. Click the X in top right corner to close. When all messages are read, the strip is grey.
- **Why can't I chat to my partner?** For security reasons, chat to partner is not available while cards for a new hand are on display. Since there is no "between round down time," there is no real partner chat.

Bidding

- **The system won't let me pass!** If you have the level (1 through 7) highlighted, you will be unable to pass/double/redouble. If you try do so, the reset button will start flashing. Click the reset button to refresh.
- **Where is the undo button?** While there is no undo button, every call made is followed by a brief cancellation time period. A **cancel** button will appear immediately below the call selected in the top center portion of the screen. If you cancel within the time period, your bidding panel will reappear for you to select the intended call. If you do not cancel within the time period, summon a director (hit red TD whistle) to request an undo (second option).

Play

1. **Why can't I click on a card?** The default setting for LoveBridge is neither a tap/click nor a double tap/click. The default setting is a drag-and-drop motion where the player pulls a card to the gray box in the center of the screen and releases to play the card. If the "pulled" card is not the intended one, the player can drag it back to the hand and select another card. **We recommend this setting while players are getting accustomed to the system.** Players may change this setting to double tap/click if desired, but we strongly discourage single tap/click settings.
2. **Whose turn is it?** In the bidding or play of the hand, the player's direction letter (N S E W) will be a white letter inside of the circle with a pale blue outer circle when it is the player's turn. The auction is always displayed so that you are on the very right and your hand is at the bottom.
3. **How do I claim?** During the play, you may click the larger blue box below the TD whistle to claim. If the claim button is grayed out (not available), you either already contributed a card to the current trick or you are dummy. (Note that you may not claim mid-trick. You may only claim between tricks.)
4. **How do I see the bidding once play has started?** Per the Laws of Duplicate Bridge, a player is not entitled to the entire auction once they have played to trick 1. If you have not yet played to trick one, the auction will be in the lower left corner. Click on it to enlarge to the center area. Click the double gray arrows in the bottom right of the center area to send it back to the corner. Similarly, this is how a player may see the cards from the previous trick (prior to playing to current trick).



EXPLANATION & CHAT GUIDE

The logic of alerts and explanations in the LoveBridge system can work multiple ways. You will use it **with self alert and screened tables**. You only alert your own calls. Both opponents can ask for more information, and they will always know the same details about bids.


Alerting

When you want to alert your call, you have multiple options:

You can **tap in the input field** and write your explanation here.

You can **tap on the alert button** so your opponent knows it's artificial.

You can **tap the envelope button** and, after placing your call, the bridge keyboard will pop up. Here you can type your explanation. Note: Your call will be alerted as well.




Bridge keyboard

Common bridge expressions are organized in seven categories to help you type bridge related messages with only a few taps.

You can type any other message using a traditional keyboard.

Your favorite explanations will be saved here.



Multiple words in every category

Bidding Panel

The closed envelope shows that you have an **unread message**.



You can always give additional information by tapping on your bid. Make sure that your explanation contains complete information about a specific call.

You can ask for additional information by sending a question mark. You can ask specific questions using the chat. (More about the chat on the next page.)


When you send an explanation, both of your opponents will receive it. Both opponents can ask for more information.

Received Explanations

You will see a pop up notification about new explanations.


You can ask for further information by simply tapping the 'Ask more info' button.

When you read the explanation, you can **close the window** with the X button.



Chat

You can use the chat to send private messages to your opponents, or you can chat with the entire table.



You can find the chat in the top left corner of the screen. You can open it by tapping the chat bar.



You can only send private messages to your partner when you are currently not playing any boards.


Android Keyboard

When writing an explanation, you can press the “done” button to switch back to the bridge keyboard.



To write a question mark: You can use the shift button or a long press on the question mark or switch to the symbol keyboard.



On the Subject of Bridge...



This hand is from a RealBridge practice session on January 3rd. Eric Greco, our hero of the evening, was sitting West. Wayne Stuart was East. Katz/Nickell were North/South respectively. During most practice sessions (this one included), it is assumed that there is IMP scoring. While the session is intended as serious practice for upcoming NABC, USBF, or WBF events, it is very player-friendly with self alerts and discussion between players and partners during both the bidding and the play. This improves partnership understandings and irons out glitches in everyone's systems.

Geoff Hampson wasn't available on January 3rd so Wayne Stuart filled in with Eric Greco. Stuart and Greco are not an established partnership. Even so, you can see that they had no trouble bidding 6NT on Board 12.



Katz led the ST. Greco quickly played dummy's S3 to Nick's S8 before going into deep thought. After several minutes, Greco emerged, following with the deuce from his hand!! Stan Barg and I were kibitzing. We could see all four hands. We were really impressed, realizing that Eric had successfully rectified the count for a perfect double squeeze.

Katz continued his attack on spades. Greco won Nickell's queen with his ace, cashed his winners and watched his teammates squirm.

Neither Nickell nor Katz could hold the necessary guards... 12 tricks for East/West for a great score in any field!

Successful squeezes are "routine" for players of great caliber. Still, they are always fun to watch, and Greco's assessment at trick one was brilliant and clearly deserves mention.

The relaxed atmosphere that accompanies the Nickell practice sessions is truly something to admire. Frequently spanning four time zones (as in this case), players may be found eating dinner while they play, running out for smoke breaks as dummy, or dealing with family excitement when the Mets score a slam of their own!


In all cases, the players show respect for one another. They use these sessions to improve their systems while enjoying each other's company. It gives the teammates a chance to play with and against one another to better assess what may occur in the "other room" during a major event.

Everyone on the Nickell team (except perhaps Bobby Levin) loves "wish tricks." They use great creativity to bring about high WT's, low WT's, multi-color WT's, and multi-suited WT's.
